### OSU Open House Slated Jan. 20

Oregon State University has scheduled open house Saturday, January 20, 1973, for high school and community college students who are interested in attending the university in years to come. Parents and teachers are invited also.

The all-day orientation program will focus on academic offerings and career opportunities. Half of the schools and departments will outline their offerings in the morning; the other half in the afternoon. Question-answer periods will be included.

General sessions are scheduled throughout the day on admissions procedures and requirements, college costs, housing, financial aid, advising-counseling, honors program, summer term, and ROTC.

The registration charge for those attending is \$3 per person, according to Dr. J. Franz Haun, director of new student programs. Lunch in one of the university dining halls is included.

Between 3,000 and 4,000 persons are expected to attend.
