Jeff Marquez hit 26 points Friday night as he led Nyssa to a 68-58 non-conference win over Middleton.

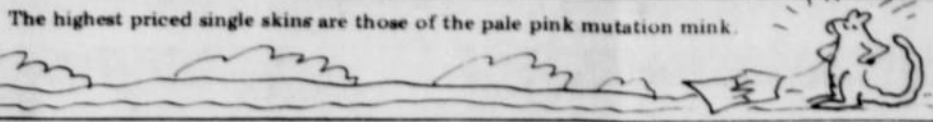

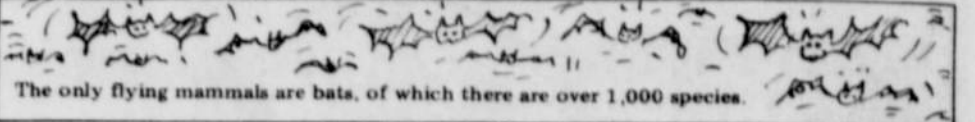

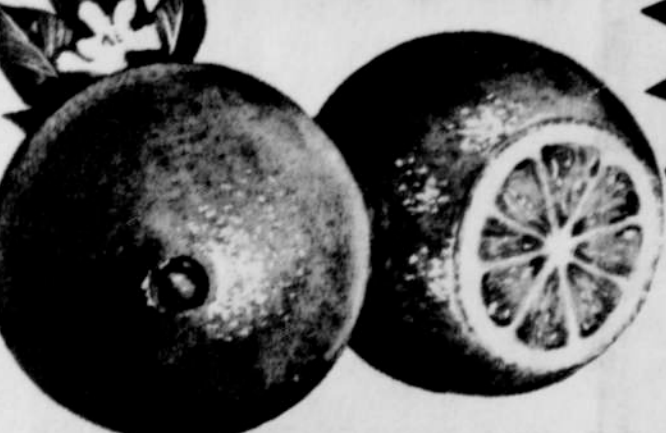
