

## OUT OF THE PAST

### 10 YEARS AGO

"The fights not over! Two battles have been waged successfully and the third is slated for this weekend. But the war will continue on until all people and all new-born have been vaccinated against polio."

These are the words of the Southwestern Idaho Medical Society and the Malheur County Medical association in their efforts to alert the people to the need to secure immunity against the dread killer and crippler.

Type III Sabin oral vaccine will be given in 15 towns of southwestern Idaho and those in Malheur County on Saturday and Sunday.

Slightly over 3000 took Type I in November, 3124 took Type II in December. Among the many families taking Type I and II vaccine was the Warren Farmer family. They included father Warren Farmer, mother Wilma, and children John, Tom, Jim, Warren Jr., Jane and Katherine.

### 20 YEARS AGO

Nyssa and vicinity will top its 1952 March of Dimes effort by better than \$1,000, according to Wilton Jackson, Nyssa campaign director, who said incomplete returns up to Wednesday indicate the city's contribution would go over the \$5,000 mark.

Fred Bracken returned from St. Louis, Mo., Saturday where he spent a week buying merchandise for his new store and expediting its shipment in time for opening day.

The new store, located near First National bank, will be opened for business in about three weeks, Bracken announced. He said also that the removal sale currently being conducted in his present location at Third and Main Streets would continue up to the day of moving to the new location.

### 30 YEARS AGO

The point system of national rationing of food will not only provide each individual in the United States with "share and share alike," but will eliminate some existing shortages, according to A.L. Atkeson, chairman of the Nyssa war price and rationing board.

"When the point system becomes effective, probably in the latter part of February," he said, "food stuffs now unavailable because unusual buying has cleaned the shelves, will be back on the market. When meat is rationed, this commodity, so scarce in some parts of the Pacific coast, can again be purchased but in equal shares."

Mr. Atkeson explained that the point system is the fairest method yet devised to provide for everyone and at the same time insure adequate food for the fighting forces. Should the demand of the armed forces create a shortage of commodities for civilians, the point system will insure that what is left for civilians will be distributed fairly to all, he stated.

### AUTO REPAIR GUARANTEES.

Consumers--and consumer organizations--have been pressing auto manufacturers to improve the quality of repair services and be more responsive to complaints. Two of the "Big Four" have taken major steps to deal with this problem and have found that it pays, both in customer satisfaction and in profits.

Consumers should be alert to changes in repair work guarantees. They will want carefully read the written document to know their rights and responsibilities. And they will see that the warranty is upheld by the local dealer.

You as a consumer play a key role in improved repair service. Complaints to a neighbor or friend solve next to nothing. Direct your dissatisfactions to the local dealer. (You may find he is now able to make the needed repair at no cost to you for either parts or labor.)

If you don't get satisfaction from the local dealer, write to the auto manufacturer giving the time, place and cost details. The Center for Auto Safety, 800 National Press Bldg., Washington D. C. 20004, and the National Highway Traffic Safety Commission, 400 7th St. S. W., Washington, D. C. 20590, are also interested in consumer problems. since 1964. Prior to that time he was also assistant chaplain of Holy Rosary Hospital, assistant of Our Lady of the Valley, LaGrande, chancellor of the Diocese and chaplain to St. Elizabeth Hospital, Baker; pastor of St. Katherine, Enterprise, pastor of St. Bridget of Kildare, Nyssa.

He also served as official of the Diocese, CCD director, secretary to the Bishop, director of the Apostleship of Prayer, director of vocations and was a member of the Committee for Church Property, and a member of the Liturgical Committee. He served as a diocesan consultant to the Bishop,

a synodal judge and director of the Priests Eucharistic League. He has spent some time in Mexico learning Spanish in order to serve the parish of Nyssa and Ontario.

Taking Fr. Baumgartner's place in Ontario will be Father Gerald Condon who comes here from St. Augustine in Merrill.

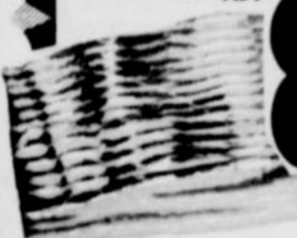
