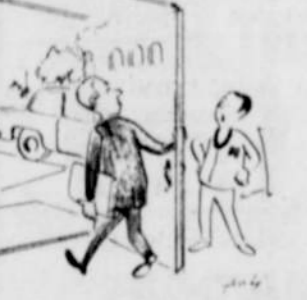
A special feature of the evening will be a demonstration on leather jackets and gloves by Mark Obenchain from Tiffany's Glove Company.
