## Favorite Foods

Have you ever baked a casserole and wished you could fry or cook your potatoes in the same oven? Well, wish no more because here's an easy way to do just that.

### OVEN FRIED POTATOES

6-8 medium potatoes  
1/2 cup melted butter or margerine  
salt.  
Peel potatoes, slice 1/4 inches thick, roll, in melted butter or margerine to coat. Place in a greased 10"x6" baking dish. Sprinkle with salt. Pour remaining butter over potatoes. Bake in a 375 degree oven for 50 minutes.

When I made this dessert on the Bonnie Wallis Show, Bonnie wrote me a note saying, "This dessert was out of this World." That was good enough for me. I made it ever after and so I'll pass it on to you.

### PINEAPPLE ANGEL DESSERT

Crust:  
18 graham crackers, crushed  
1/2 cup butter or margerine, melted  
1/3 cup sugar  
Mix and sprinkle 1/2 of this into an 8"x8" baking dish.  
Filling:  
1 pkg. lemon gelatine  
1 cup very hot water  
1/2 cup pineapple juice  
1/2 cup sugar  
1 cup whipped cream  
5 egg whites, beaten  
1-#2 can crushed pineapple  
Dissolve gelatine in hot water, add juice and sugar. Place in refrigerator until set. Whip set gelatine, whip cream, beat egg whites. Fold cream and egg whites into gelatine mixture. Fold in well drained crushed pineapple, sprinkle with remaining cracker mixture. Refrigerate until well set. Serves 8.

## Payette Fatality

### Kills Pulsipher

Payette County's first highway fatality of 1973 occurred Friday evening at 5:17 p.m. with the death of George Pulsipher, 85, Route 2, Parma.

The victim was a passenger in a 1966 sedan driven by his wife Alice M. Pulsipher, 64. The second vehicle involved was a 1957 sedan driven by Joe Martin Law, 16, Fruitland.

The accident happened at the intersection of Whitely Drive and SW Second Avenue, about one mile south of Fruitland.

According to Payette County Sheriff's Department, the Pulsipher car was traveling south on Whitely Drive. It was struck in the right rear by the vehicle driven by Law which was traveling east on SW Second Avenue.

The impact sent the Pulsipher car into a spin and into a tree just off the highway, the impact throwing the victim from the vehicle. The Law sedan, which was totaled, wound up in a small irrigation ditch.

Officers cited Law for failure to yield right of way.

Mrs. Pulsipher was released from Holy Rosary Hospital in Ontario Sunday.
