

HUNTING & FISHING LICENSE SALE SHOW DROP IN 1972

An increase in nonresident fishing and hunting license fees and the daily angling license fee combined with poor deer hunting prospects last fall re-

sulted in an overall drop in angling and hunting license sales in 1972, according to the Game Commission. With reports al-

most complete from license agents throughout the state, increases were noted in sales of resident and 10-day angling licenses as well as elk tags but sales of all other major li-

cense and tag categories dropped from 7 percent to 37 percent.

General hunting and fishing license holders totaled just over 623,100 compared with 611,300 the previous year. This figure does not include daily or salmon-steelhead licenses, sales of which fell off considerably from 1971.

Combination hunting-fishing license sales remained almost identical to the previous year at just over 143,600. Resident anglers increased by over 21,400, totaling almost 266,400 licenses issued. Vacation anglers increased by over 6,000 users, with sales of these li-

censes totaling almost 35,200. Nonresident anglers dropped from just over 11,500 licenses issued in 1971 to 9,900 in 1972. The sale of resident hunting licenses dropped by over 12,700 totaling just over 162,900. Non-

resident hunting licenses also fell off from the previous year by over 1,800, totaling just over 5,000 in 1972. Deer tag sales dropped from 281,600 in 1971 to 254,700 last year. Nonresident elk tag sales remained the same but resident elk tags issued totaled almost 76,600, an increase of over 4,700 tags.

The sale of daily angling licenses took a considerable drop from the 303,500 issued in 1971 to 190,700 in 1972. Over 62,800 daily licenses were used in the ocean sport fishery and the remainder on inland waters. The cost of the daily license increased in 1972 from \$1.50 to \$2.50. Salmon-steelhead licenses also showed a sharp decline from 333,000 issued in 1971 to just over 254,700 in 1972. In 1972 a salmon-steelhead license was not required with the daily angling license when angling for salmon or steelhead.

In addition to the change in the daily angling license fee, other increased fees in 1972 were \$10 for the 10-day vacation angling license, \$20 for the nonresident angling license, and
