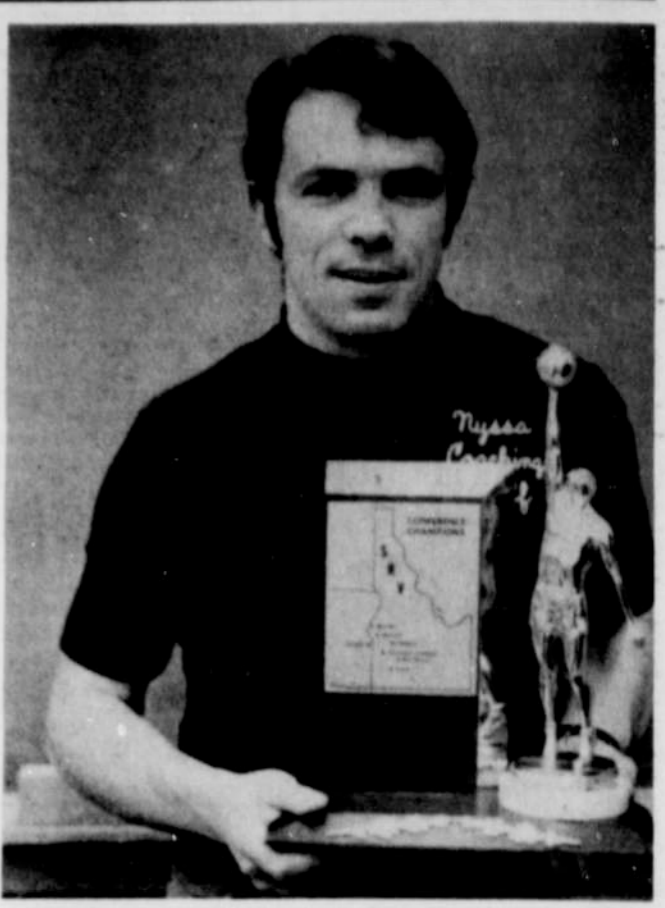
Nyssa Places Third SRV Soph Tourney

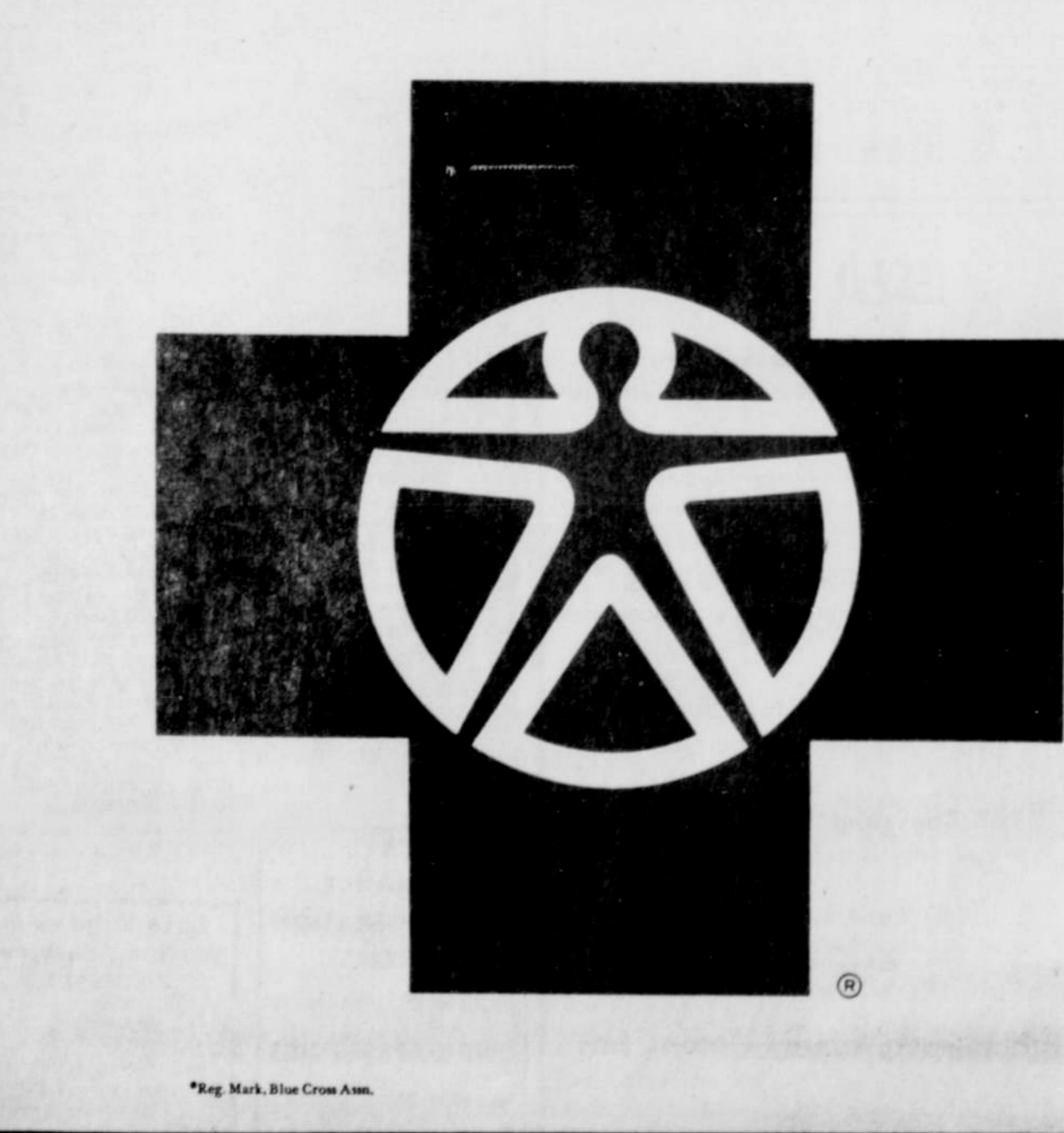
