Fine white-face cattle and herds of Holsteins were noticeable from the highway. The City of Refuge near Kona was interesting but one of the biggest thrills of the trip took place when some of the men of the tour group went deep-sea fishing and Mr. Perez caught a 9 ft. 3 in. Marlin weighing about 160 pounds!

On the Island of Maui were beautiful jungled valleys, the Haleakala Crater (world's largest dormant volcano) and the pioneer whaling town of Lahaina where many enjoyed a glass bottom boat ride and watched a scuba diver pick up lovely coral pieces from the ocean floor.
