

Smith Opposes Farm Bills

Senator Robert F. Smith, R-Burns, announced today his opposition to a trio of farm labor bills introduced in the Oregon Senate.

Smith's action followed public hearings held last Wednesday in Salem on the proposed legislation. Senate Bill 180 would repeal restrictions on picketing of agricultural production sites.

Smith noted that testimony given by the Department of Labor indicated that there would be a problem in administering the unemployment program and that it would deplete the state's reserve for paying unemployment benefits due to the rates.

The sponsor of the bill admitted that marginal farmers might be driven out of business if the unemployment bill passed.

Smith felt SB 182 would deprive farmers and ranchers of protection against labor stoppages that could cause loss of crops. Smith said that many crops must be harvested within a certain period of time or they are lost.

In announcing his opposition to SB 181, Smith observed it

would deprive many youngsters from summer work as well as valuable experience for working. According to the Oregon Farm Bureau Federation the bill could cause the demise of small farms.
