**BANANA FRITTERS WITH SOUR CREAM**

1 egg	2 teaspoons melted butter
1/2 cup milk	4 bananas
1/2 cup flour	Juice of 1 lemon
2 teaspoons sugar	2 tablespoons powdered sugar
1/2 teaspoon baking powder	Oil or shortening for frying
1/2 teaspoon salt	

Separate egg and beat white until stiff. Beat yolk with milk. Stir in flour mixed with sugar, baking powder and salt. Stir in butter. Fold in beaten egg white. Cut bananas into serving pieces. Cut lemon in half and squeeze juice over bananas. Sprinkle with powdered sugar. With fingers, dip banana pieces into batter, coating evenly. Fry a few at a time in 2 inches hot oil heated to 375 degrees 2 or 3 minutes until golden brown. Drain on paper towels. Serve hot with dairy sour cream. Makes 4 or 5 servings.

**Market Basket**

Dollar conscious food shoppers will note that many vegetable prices have lowered...

...due to better weather conditions in growing areas. Best fresh vegetable buys, according to Velma Seat, Extension Food Marketing Specialist, Oregon State University include BROCCOLI, CAULIFLOWER, CABBAGE and CARROTS.

Goodly amounts of fresh TOMATOES are coming in from Mexico with a resultant drop in price. EGG PLANT is in good supply and prices are moderate. This versatile vegetable can be fried, broiled, baked, stuffed or scalloped.

GREEN PEPPERS are less costly than they were. Fresh MUSHROOMS add a note of luxury to any meal and usually cost less than the canned product.

More APPLES are coming from Controlled Atmosphere Storage. This means somewhat higher retail prices. However, the apples are top quality as only the best fruit go into CA storage, and they are crisp and juicy when they come out. Keep them refrigerated until ready to use.

GRAPEFRUIT is at its peak of sweetness and prices will likely not get any lower. D'ANJOU WINTER PEARS will be on the market for about another month. Coupled with good cheese they make a nutritious and inviting dessert.

BROILER FRYERS, both whole and cut-up birds, are frequently advertised at special prices. TURKEY is also in the ads and excellent buys are to be found on turkey hind quarters. Turkey parts are also available. B-Grade turkeys are often a bargain. The B-Grade denotes some exterior flaw such as torn skin or missing wing tip which does not affect eating quality. Birds may be cooked unstuffed and any extra meat can be frozen for future use in casseroles, salads, sandwiches, etc.

PORK supplies are lower than is usual for this time of year and prices reflect this situation. BEEF specials include steaks and chuck roasts. When evaluating the chuck cuts remember that the blade roast lies next to the tender rib roast and is the most tender of the chuck cuts. However, the blade cut provides less edible meat per pound because it contains more bone and fat waste than the round bone roast. Figure 3 servings per pound for the round bone roast and only 2 from the blade cut.
