Favorite Foods

Do you often want to make a tasty dessert which you can stir up in minutes when friends drop in unexpectedly? Here's an idea. Have an angel food cake tucked away in your freezer. Then while they're getting settled in the living room, make this orange-pineapple topping.

ORANGE PINEAPPLE TOPPING

4 egg yolks
1 cup sugar
2 oranges (juiced)
1 cup crushed pineapple, (drained)
1 tsp. cornstarch
1 cup whipped topping
Place all ingredients except the whipped topping in a saucepan and cook over low heat until the mixture thickens, stirring constantly. Cool. Fold in whipped topping. Slice angel food cake and serve with topping. Serves 8 - 10.

Have you shopped for fish lately? I learned, years ago, that when meat and fish prices rise to look for "stretches". In the following recipe, the "stretches" are nutritious as well as tasty.

RICE RING WITH TUNA

1 1/2 cup rice
3 cups water
1 1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 cup celery (chopped)
1/4 cup onion (chopped)
1/4 cup parsley (chopped)
1 cup sharp cheese (grated)
1/2 cup olives (chopped)
1 - 7 oz. can mushroom soup
1/2 cup water
1 - 6 1/2 oz. can tuna
Cook rice with water and salt, mix celery, onion, parsley, cheese, and olives. Fold into rice. Pack rice mixture into a round mold and bake 10 minutes at 350 degrees. Heat mushroom soup, water, and tuna. Serve inside tuna ring which has been unmolded on a platter. Serves 8.

To cook the rice, you can use a method I've used for years. It's easy, it's good and the rice cooks into fluffy kernels.

STEAMED RICE
Into a two quart pan, pour the 1 1/2 cups of rice. Add the 3 cups of water and 1 1/2 tsp. salt. Cover. Turn unit on high. When mixture boils, turn unit off and let stand on unit for 30 minutes.

DIAMOND HEAD SANDWICH

6 servings

2 cups cooked shrimp
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1/2 cup chopped celery
2 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
1 tablespoon finely chopped parsley
1 teaspoon finely chopped onion
1/2 cup dairy sour cream
1/2 loaf vienna bread
Butter softened
2 cans (4 1/2-oz. each) deviled ham
8 slices pineapple, well drained and cut in half
12 slices tomato
1 cup (4 oz.) shredded cheddar cheese
Chopped parsley

In a bowl toss shrimp with lemon juice; mix in celery, eggs, parsley and onion. Gently blend in sour cream. Set aside. Cut bread in half lengthwise. Place in broiler pan. Spread each half with butter; toast under broiler. Partially cut through bread to make 3 servings per half. Spread each half with deviled ham. Arrange pineapple slices on ham; top with slices of tomato. Spoon shrimp mixture over tomatoes; sprinkle with cheese. Broil until cheese melts and is lightly browned. Carefully slice into portions and serve garnished with parsley.
