CANCER SOCIETY'S OREGON CHAIRMAN

Gerry P. Crockwell, Portland insurance executive, will serve as Oregon chairman of the American Cancer Society's April crusade for funds to finance its programs in research, public and professional education and service, according to Larry Hilaire, president of the Oregon division, ACS.

Crockwell, a partner in Crockwell & Maxwell, medical-professional underwriters, is a director of the Oregon division and a former president of the Multnomah county unit, ACS. He is a member of the executive board, Columbia-Pacific Council, Boy Scouts of America, and a life trustee of Lewis and Clark College.

Assisting in the crusade as our area chairman will be Rev. Arthur Baehmann of Pendleton, eastern Oregon.

"The vital services of research, education and service account for 79 cents of every dollar spent by the society," Crockwell stated. "Research, which has scored dramatic advances, last year received \$24 million or about 35 per cent."

During the past year, he added, over \$88,000 in Oregon division funds and \$59,272 in national ACS funds were allocated for research by scientists in Oregon, a majority of them at the University of Oregon medical school.

Potatoes and Onions Lead

Potatoes and onions continued to lead the movement of fresh produce to Oregon markets in February.

They accounted for almost 83 percent of the month's total 2,939 carlots processed by the federal-state shipping point inspection service, according to figures released by the Oregon Department of Agriculture. 1,460 carlots of Klamath Basin and Central Oregon potatoes and 989 carlots of onions from Malheur County and Willamette Valley points figured largely in the overall total. The figure is 971 cars fewer than fresh produce shipments in January.

Pears from Hood River and Medford accounted for 330 carlots; apples from Hood River and Milton-Freewater for 111 and brine cherries from The Dalles and Salem for 25.

From the Willamette Valley, filberts filled 22 cars and walnuts, one. A single car of miscellaneous items made up the balance of the February shipments.

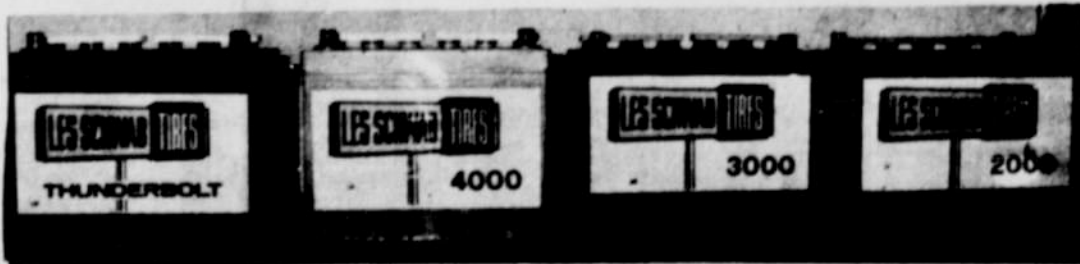
