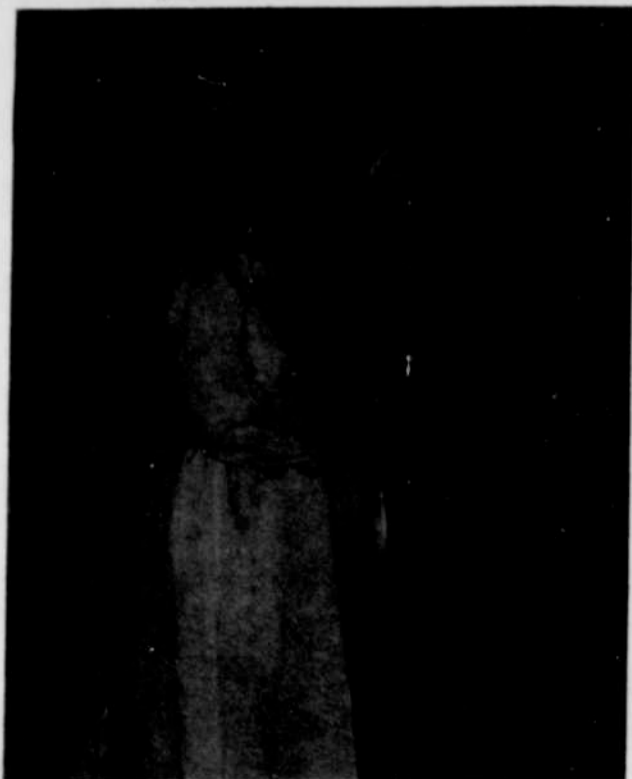


Pink and Yellow Theme At Bump - Moore Wedding
