Nampa Stampede To Feature Female Singers

Lynn Anderson and Jody Miller, two of the nation's top female country-western vocalists have been signed up to entertain Stampede spectators at the 58th annual Snake River Stampede, July 17 - 21 according to A.E. Voyles, Stampede President.

Lynn, who will be appearing at the rodeo on the first three nights, has proven herself to be one of the youngest, prettiest and above all, most talented stars in the country and western sky.

She's made appearances on the Hee Haw series, the Johnny Cash Show, the Joey Bishop Show and recently appeared on the Kraft Music Hall. Her current hit recording, "Rose Garden" is a million seller and tops both the pop and country western charts. Many will remember Lynn as a talented singer on the Lawrence Welk program where she continues to make appearances "whenever I can make it to California."

The second star of the 1973 Stampede, Jody Miller, will entertain on July 20 and 21, the last two nights of the Nampa rodeo, Voyles said.

Jody was born in Phoenix, Arizona, raised in Oklahoma and has a southwestern warmth that comes across in her relaxed, easy-going manner of performing. She has a "girl next door" appearance which

captures every audience she has appeared before.

She entertains with both contemporary and country songs, and says her finest audiences have been the GI who she has entertained in the Far East. "I suppose," says Jody, "I was a more pleasant type of bombshell to their ears."

Jody's first recording, "He Walks Like a Man," was an immediate hit when made in 1964, and another nation-wide hit "Queen of the House" earned her a Grammy Award in 1966.

Voyles said the Stampede Board of Directors were very pleased to be able to get Lynn and Jody for the 1973 Rodeo - continuing a past policy of presenting the top talent of the entertainment world to Stampede spectators.

BOOK AND RECORD CLUBS Does it pay to join a book or record of the month club? Here is one way of making that decision. Add up everything you promise to pay in two ways, with the special gifts you get for joining and without them. Be sure to include handling charges. Check to see what the same merchandise costs through local discount stores. You now are able to tell whether you should join and continue buying, whether you should join and quit once you have fulfilled your membership obligation, or whether you should forget the club offer entirely.

When initially applying for GI Bill benefits, a veteran should include a copy of his Report of Separation (DD Form 214). This reduces processing time. Application should be made at the nearest VA office.

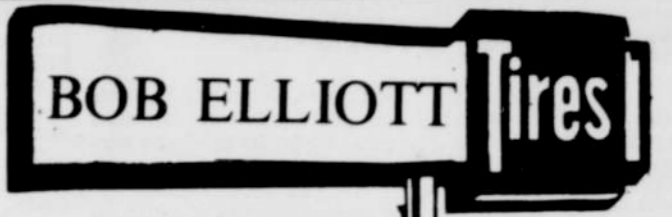
