NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Big Bend Irrigation District sitting as a Board of Equalization will meet on the 1st day of May, 1973, at 8:00 P.M. of said day at the residence of W. C. Van DeWater, Secretary, within said District, for the purpose of reviewing and correcting its assessment roll and apportionment of charges for operation, maintenance and construction for the 1973-1974 fiscal year. The assessment of \$0.25 per acre is levied for operation and maintenance of the Big Bend Unit of the District. \$0.20 per acre is levied for the operation and maintenance of the Park Unit of the District. \$3.80 per acre is levied to meet the construction and rehab (as determined by the Secretary of Interior) of the Park Unit of the District for the 1973-74 fiscal year.

The annual operation and maintenance charge of \$6.50 per acre for the season of 1973 for the Park Unit is the rate set by the Boise Project Board of Control. All water used in excess of 3-1/2 acre feet per acre is \$1.85 per acre foot. The assessment roll and record may be inspected by any interested person at the office of the Secretary.

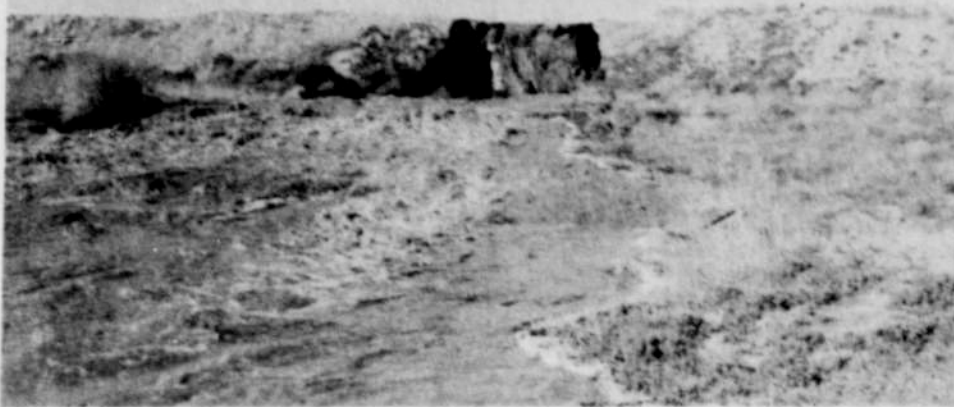
REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

1. PROPERTY TAX LIMITATION; SCHOOL TAX REVISION—Purpose: Retains limitations on school tax levies for bonds, capital expenditures, transportation and intermediate education districts. Limits school districts' other tax levies to \$2 per \$1,000 value. Permits state-wide school tax on nonresidential property not exceeding \$10 per \$1,000 value. Makes effective legislation increasing personal income and corporate tax rates, limiting federal tax deduction, creating business profits tax, prescribing revenue distribution for school districts, and declaring preservation of local school control the public policy of Oregon.

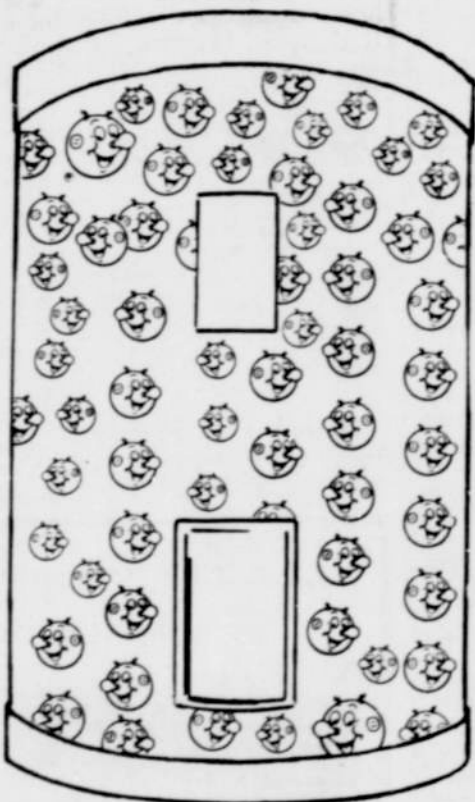
THE OWYHEE DITCH BROKE five miles north of Nyssa early Friday morning, flooding fields and running over Highway 201 near Imperial Avenue.

The 15-foot break in the ditch can be seen in the top photo, and was apparently caused by a gopher hole, resulting in extensive damage before the water could be shut off.

Repairs were made and water was again flowing in the ditch by Saturday evening.

The lower photo shows water cascading over the highway, with traffic forced to move very slowly most of Friday. The field at left is owned by Vaughn Stringer and farmed by Darwin Jensen, both Nyssa, where Jensen had just completed planting the field to potatoes.

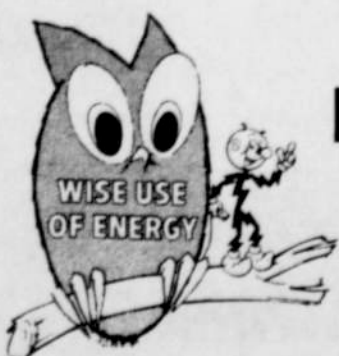
