BLM TO CONSTRUCT NEW ACCESS ROAD

Construction on the Star Valley road which will provide access to one of Malheur County's more remote areas will begin in the near future, George R. Gurr, manager of the Vale BLM District, said this week.

Located in the southern part of the county, the 21 miles of unsurfaced road will connect the existing Star Valley road at Anderson Crossing to the Little Owyhee road in Nevada, providing access from Jackson

Creek to Paradise Valley, as well as access into the Star Valley area.

A tour for prospective contractors to view the road site will leave from the Shell station at McDermitt, Nevada at 7:00 a.m. PDT on Wednesday, May 9.

Gurr said bids for the job will be opened at 2:00 p.m. May 25 in the BLM's Portland Service Center.

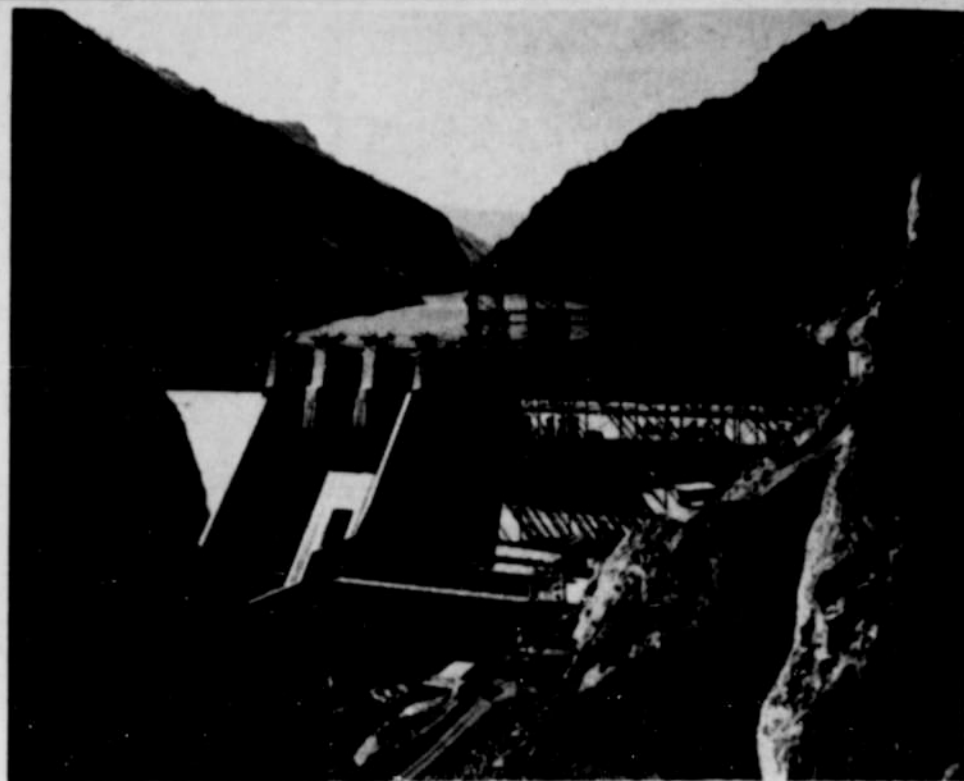
The new Alumni Director comes to the University from Portland State University, where he has been an instructor in physical education and head offensive coordinator for football since last fall.
