MALHEUR MEMORIAL HOSPITAL A Report To The People

National Hospital week is May 6-12 and we think this is an ideal time to bring you up to date on your hospital.

For the benefit of the people new to the western Treasure Valley area and a reminder to those of you who have lived here for some time, we present a resume of how our hospital was organized.

The following is taken from a statement dated October 24, 1947. This large and rapidly growing area, can be made self-reliant like other areas in this state. We must provide a modern hospital that will give adequate protection to our citizens and stop the needless loss of life that is now taking place because of the lack of a hospital. The hospital problem is a problem for all of us.

The protection of the lives and health of our families and neighbors is vital to our welfare as a community. We can wait no longer. In order to stop the needless loss of human lives we must have this hospital to serve our area. We have adopted the hospital campaign slogan "Build Memorial Hospital Today! Tomorrow May Be Too Late." Signed Frank T. Morgan, President, Malheur Memorial Hospital Association.

So started the Malheur Memorial Hospital. It was on October 30, 1947 that the services of Louis D. Barr of Oakland, California was obtained to advise on the planning and financing the hospital.
