TVCC Woodchukars Make Plans For Carnival

The Treasure Valley Community College Woodchukars, an outdoor club with strong interest in forestry and recreation, has spent the past year earnestly building toward hosting intercollegiate timber carnival competition on campus. The group, which has existed only a year, has carried on fund raising activities and taken an active part in all aspects of college life. Under the advisement of Ken Knothe, Treasure Valley Community College Forestry Technology instructor, they are making steady progress toward their goal.

Several contributors have come forward with gifts to further the carnival efforts. Mailheur Home Telephone donated a climbing pole, climbing equipment, and instruction. Payette Idaho Power gave a pole and the use of equipment for planting it. The Emmett Boise Cascade Wood Products Division provided two peeler logs for us and crosscut competition and wood chips to be used as bedding for all off-the-ground events.

The Woodchukars are readying an area provided by the college for practice and eventually for the carnival itself. Although there will be no carnival this year, club members plan to hold intramural games. Also, a team of ten will travel to Spokane, May 12, to enter timber carnival competition there, sponsored by Spokane Falls Community College. They will vie in events such as match splitting, pole climbing, single and double crosscut, bucking with chain saw, log rolling, compass reading, height and width object measurement, and ax throwing.

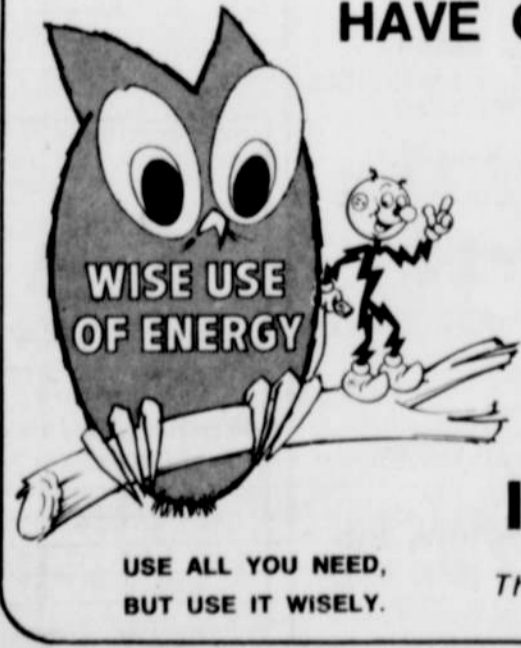
