### Third 4-H Horse Show At Fairgrounds Saturday

The third annual Malheur County 4-H Invitational Horse Show is scheduled for this Saturday, May 26, at the Malheur County Fairgrounds. Evelyn Sword, show secretary, said today that over 100 entries have been received from Oregon and Idaho counties.

The counties represented include Grant, Union, Harney, Baker and Malheur in Oregon and Canyon, Washington, Owyhee, Payette and Gem counties in Idaho.

The horse show events, which will begin at 9 a.m., include western horsemanship, showmanship, English equitation, trail horse class, pole bending and barrel racing. Showmanship and horsemanship will be conducted in the morning with the remainder of the classes in the afternoon.

Each event will be divided into Junior (9-11), Intermediate (12-14), and Senior (15-19) classes. Judging will be on the Danish system with trophies awarded to first place winners

in each age group in each class. Others will receive ribbons. Refreshments will be available at the fairgrounds so youngsters need not leave the fairgrounds during the event. Spectators can also eat on the grounds.
