Favorite Foods

When a friend sends me a recipe and it looks as tho it might be a winner I try it - and presto it goes into my file as a favorite. I went to a church picnic this week and took the chipped beef-macaroni casserole and it passed with flying colors. Since it has eggs, chipped beef and cheese in it it's high in protein and easy on the food budget.

CHIPPED BEEF-MACARONI CASSEROLE

1/4 lb. chipped beef
1/2 cup chopped onion
1 cup shredded sharp cheese
1 cup mushroom soup (1 can)
1/2 cup milk
1 cup elbow macaroni (uncooked)
2 hard boiled eggs, chopped
1 tsp. salt
1/3 tsp. pepper
1/2 tsp. m.s.g.
Combine ingredients, and pour into a 2 qt. greased casserole. Let stand over night in refrigerator. Next day bake 1 hour at 350 degrees. Serves six.

I've been looking for a Sara Lee Pound Cake ever since I got the following recipe. Of course an ordinary pound cake or even an angel food would be good in this dessert. When part of the dessert is already prepared it takes minutes to prepare and assemble.

After the Torte is refrigerated for several hours it may be frozen for future use. My family says I have to freeze everything before we can eat it!

CHOCOLATE TORTE

1 Sara Lee Pound Cake
1 cup sour cream
1 6 oz. pkg. chocolate bits, melted
1 tsp. vanilla
1 tsp. instant coffee
Slice the pound cake into 4 or 5 strips horizontally. Ice each layer with the icing and stack. Cover cake with icing. Refrigerate for several hours.
