

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Minutes of the Malheur County Court Meeting - April 4, 1973:

Court met with Judge Roy Hirai presiding and Commissioners E.W. Maag and Sam Hartley present.

Court signed a plat approving the Ritter Sub-Division.

Oscar Bratton met with the Court concerning the salary for a draftsman for the Assessor's Office. Also discussed salary of appraiser who has applied for the vacancy of an appraiser in Assessor's Office.

Court is to write letter of acceptance to the City of Ontario, for housing of prisoners.

Court met with Frank Yruegan, District Attorney, Kurt Swinburnson, Assistant D.A., Norman Poole, Juvenile Advisory Board Representative, and Fred Robinson, Juvenile Department Director regarding salary to be paid to the Juvenile Dept. Secretary.

Court met with Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Easterday regarding the vacation of an old road and an easement for a new road. The Easement Order was signed by the Court and Mr. and Mrs. Easterday.

Approved Order No. 24, In the Matter of Payment of Claims, hereby ordering the County Auditor to issue warrants totaling \$66,187.77

Minutes of the Malheur County Court Meeting - April 9, 1973:

Court met with Judge Hirai presiding and Commissioners E.W. Maag and Sam Hartley present.

Approved by Motion to pay a bill in the amount of \$36.85, to Hubert McNeill for repairing 3 drawers in the Court desk.

Court considered the rough draft concerning the Atherton Kennels drawn up by the District Attorney's Office. It was decided to send this draft to the cities of Vale, Ontario, Nyssa, for their consideration.

Court adjourned.

Minutes of the Malheur County Court Meeting - April 11, 1973:

Court met with Judge Roy Hirai presiding, with Commissioners E.W. Maag and Sam Hartley present.

Bids were opened on 2 pickups and 10 cars.

Bid from Gentry Ford for 12 units was \$35,626.36.

Bid from Kessler Chevrolet for 12 units was \$36,549.26

Bid from Barrentine for 10 units was \$31,763.20

Bid from Woodpecker for 2 pickups was \$6,324.26

Bid was awarded to Mathews Chevrolet, whose bid for 12 units was \$34,932.00

Approved by Motion to accept the Mathews Chevrolet bid of \$34,932.00, as a package deal on the twelve units.

The bid price did not include undercoating on 11 units, so the court decided to have this done at a cost of \$20.00 per unit, for a total of \$220.00. Also, to have drip moldings put on the 2 pickups, at a cost of \$18.00 each, for a total of \$36.00.

The Court considered the legislative bill changing the collection of taxes from the Sheriff's Office to the Treasurer's Office. The Court decided to talk to Sheriff Ingram and Pat Bond after the legislature has passed the bill.

The Cities of Ontario, Nyssa and Vale would like the latest salary schedule for the Atherton Kennels to be implemented on July 1, 1973, so their budgets can be set up to include the cost.

Lindsay Soft Water representative presented the Court with a bid of \$1,525.00 for a new soft water unit, with trade. The approximate cost of repairing the old unit would be \$198.00. The Court decided to have the old unit repaired, and Lindsay Soft Water is to order the parts.

Judge Roy Hirai asked Barbara Morgan to get the latest salary schedule from all the nursing homes, and set up a meeting with the advisory Committee, the Court, representatives from the Nursing Homes, and the Holy Rosary Hospital, to work out a wage schedule and the price of day care.

Approved by Motion that the Court buy the books by the United States Code

Service, replacing the books by the United States Code Annotated Service.

Request from Fred Robinson, Director of Juvenile Department, for raise in salary for Juvenile Secretary. Court will consider request.

Court adjourned.

Minutes of the Malheur County Court Meeting - April 17, 1973:

Court met with Judge Roy Hirai presiding, and Commissioners E.W. Maag and Sam Hartley present.

Court discussed the starting salary for a new girl in the Clerk's Office. It was decided that her salary should begin at \$358.00, and after six months it should be increased to the next step of \$376.00

Approved by Motion to employ Sharon Aronson, as secretary and assistant women's counselor in the Juvenile Department at a beginning salary, starting April 1, 1973 of \$376.00, with an increase as of November 1, 1973 to \$395.00 and the next step to be \$415.00 on July 1, 1974

Court discussed a meeting of Oregon-Washington institute of planners, from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, that are to hold a meeting on Revenue Sharing - Special Community Development Sharing.

Approved by Motion that two representatives attend from Malheur County, either the County Judge and the Auditor or the Judge and a Commissioner.

Approved by Motion for Judge Roy Hirai to attend the Regional Meeting in Alaska.

The Eastern Oregon Parks Division is to meet the Court at 1:00 P.M. Thursday at the Twilight Cafe in Nyssa, to tour Succor Creek Park. The Parks Division also wants to discuss with the Court, using equipment to improve roads in the State Parks. The state will compensate the County Court for the use of the equipment.

The County Court had requested permission of Curt Duvall, State Highway Department, to leave the piling and abutments on the old Bully Creek-Greenfield Bridge site to stop erosion. Mr. Duvall gave permission to leave piling and abutments, and the Court called Mr. Weatherby, whose property is involved, to inform him of the decision.

Approved by Motion that the Court approve the lease to the Bureau of Reclamation for grazing rights to the Willowcreek Livestock Association.

Judge Hirai read the official notification that Charbeanneau Inskip Station at Danner, has been entered in the National Historical Register.

The County has received \$4,000.00 from DEQ, Solid Waste funds, that have been turned over to Pat Bond, from the state.

Ross Burt asked the Court to put a notice in the papers that the Bully Creek Park is now open for business.

The Court signed an application from the BLM, asking to put in a new cat-guard on a county road.

The Court signed a quit-claim deed for county land that was sold to Phillip E. and Dorothy Ann Webb, at a tax sale in 1972, with the following description:

South 1/2 of Lot 15 and all of Lots 16 thru 20, Blk 11, Original Addition, Adrian, Oregon, being located in Section 14, Twp. 21, Range 46, Malheur County, Oregon.

Court adjourned.

Minutes of the Malheur County Court Meeting - April 18, 1973:

Court met with Judge Roy Hirai presiding and Commissioners E.W. Maag and Sam Hartley present.

The Bureau of Reclamation and Malheur County have a cost sharing agreement for new improvements on Agency and Bully Creek Reservoirs. The Bureau will pay 50 percent when they are presented with the records of payments that have been made. The Bureau has \$9,000.00 available for match money that has to be used before June 30, 1973.

If Malheur County can only match part of this money, the Bureau would like to know how much, so the balance can be used in other areas. W.E. Gillespie is to check the needs for recreation and the court is to let the Bureau know the amount of funds that the county can match by May 10th. The Bureau would like to have a projection of needs

ahead into next year, and the county to obligate themselves before June 30, 1973.

Court met with Jack Collins, Ontario City Manager, and representatives from the City of Ontario regarding the payment of EDA dues.

Judge Hirai stated that the County had not paid last year's dues because they had not been planned for in the budget.

Judge Hirai said he could not commit the Court until the EDA dues could be brought before the Budget Committee for their decision.

Approved Order No. 25, In the Matter of Payment of Claims, hereby ordering the County Auditor to issue warrants totaling \$43,765.98

Court adjourned.

Minutes of the Malheur County Court Meeting - April 24, 1973:

Court met with Judge Roy-Hirai presiding, and Commissioners E.W. Maag and Sam Hartley present.

Court signed a permit for Cascade Natural Gas to work on Sunset Drive in Ontario.

Approved Order No. 26, In the Matter of Payment of Claims, hereby ordering the County Auditor to issue warrants totaling \$132,269.65

Permission was granted by Commissioners E.W. Maag and Sam Hartley for Health Administrator, Mary Ellen Nelson, to store equipment for the Family Planning Service in a locked shop at her home until an office is obtained.

Court adjourned.

The BLM asked the Court for permission to burn around the dumps in the county. The Court granted permission.

Richard Jentsch called the Court requesting a progress report on the planning and zoning for the county. The court will make a report in about a week.

Judge Hirai read a report on H.B. 2582 allowing the Court to appoint a Commissioner. O.A.C. legislative committee went on record as opposing the bill.

Court adjourned.

Beat cream cheese until soft. Beat in remaining ingredients. Makes 1 1/2 cups.

MONTEREY CHEESE SPREAD

1 (8-ounce) package cream cheese
2 cups grated Monterey Jack cheese
1/3 cup drained chopped pimiento
1 teaspoon chicken seasoned stock base
Beat cream cheese until soft. Beat in remaining ingredients. Use as sandwich spread or chili and roll into balls between palms of hands. Makes 2 1/4 cups.

Ore Dairymen Receive Top Ad Award

Oregon dairymen have received the highest national advertising award for their 1972 milk promotion and advertising, according to Ray Kozak, executive secretary of the Oregon Dairy Products Commission.

The Commission was named winner of the 1973 national "Ady" first place award for outdoor advertising campaigns.

Presented by the American Advertising Federation, the award was based on the Commission's advertising campaign which utilized foreign language translations of the popular "Every Body Needs Milk" slogan.

The same campaign also won an additional award in the Regional AAF "Best in the West" competition for entry in the national competition.

The campaign was jointly created and produced for the dairy commissions of Oregon and Washington by their advertising agencies, Thummel, Marx & Associates, Portland, and Ricks-Ehrig of Seattle.

Believed to be the first time a dairy sponsored program has been awarded the top advertising award, the campaign utilized the successful "Every Body Needs Milk" theme translated into the costumes and languages of foreign countries including France, West Germany, Great Britain (Scotland), Norway and the Netherlands (Holland).

The foreign theme received a boost from eye-catching Aggela Cartwright, who posed for the kick-off advertisement which used a French motif.

Best known for her portrayal of Danny Thomas' daughter Linda in the longrunning "Make Room for Daddy" television series, Miss Cartwright made a
