Several Nyssa players had solid hits and Tony Estrada had two homers on errors with some outstanding base running.

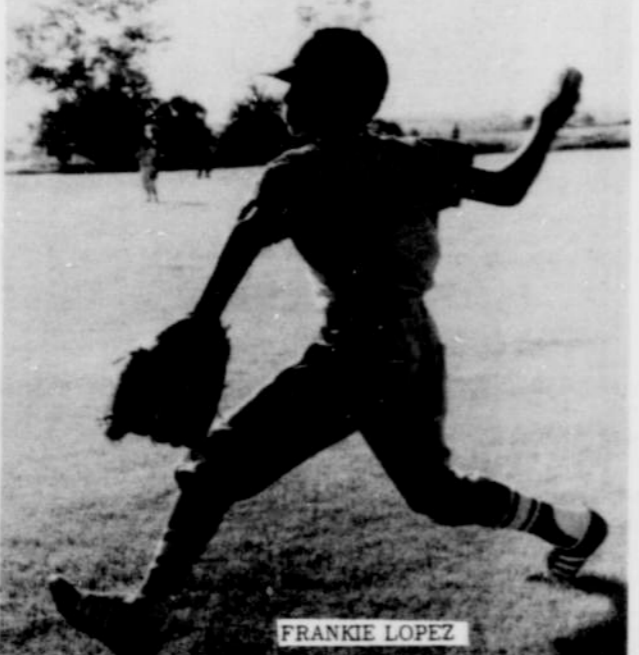
The Nyssa team goes into their last week with two wins, over Vale and Cow Hollow, and two losses, to Ontario and Fruitland.

Malheur 4-H Summer Camp To Be Conducted in Mid-July

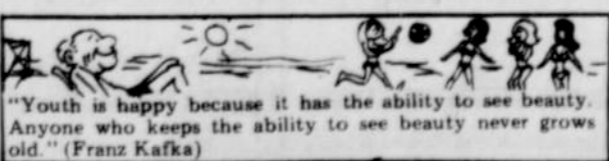
Four days of camping at Lake Creek Camp, evening campfires, frog races, fishing, hiking into the Strawberry Wilderness area, meeting new friends and having fun will all be part of the 1973 4-H Summer Camp to be conducted July 18-21.

Ron Mobley, Malheur County Extension Agent, stated that this camp is a 4-H activity; however, all Malheur County young people between the ages of 9 and 14 are invited to participate. The cost of camp will be \$18.00. This fee covers meals, lodging, insurance, materials and transportation will be by school bus. The schedule will be to leave Malheur County at approximately 10:00 a.m. on July 18 and return at 4:00 p.m. on July 21. As the camper applications are received, an exact schedule will be developed.

Lake Creek Camp is located just south of Strawberry Mountain in Grant County at the headwaters of the Malheur River. This scenic location makes it ideal for hiking, fishing, water sports, and nature and wildlife investigations. The camp is well equipped with a modern

lodge and kitchen, restroom facilities, "A" frame cabins and recreation equipment. The materials that campers will be asked to bring are - sleeping bags, hiking shoes, warm clothing, rain gear, fishing equipment, insect repellent and enthusiasm.

Mobley stated that applications have gone out to everyone that is currently enrolled in a 4-H project and encourages those not receiving applications to please contact the Malheur County Extension Office for more information on applications. He concluded by saying that the first 100 applications will be guaranteed of the chance to attend this year's camp, so that those interested in attending should turn in their applications or contact the Extension Office at the earliest possible date.
