Nyssa Girl Scalded

A 12-year-old Nyssa girl was hospitalized last Saturday afternoon for treatment of burns she received when a pressure cooker of boiling water exploded.

Larae Robinson, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Robinson, suffered second-degree burns on the lower part of her face, chest, right arm and upper leg, according to Mrs. Robinson. The pressure cooker was not pressurized, but apparently became sealed while heating on the stove. When Larae went to turn the stove off, the cooker exploded and splashed her with boiling water.

"We put her in ice water seconds after it happened," said Mrs. Robinson. "That helped keep the burns from becoming third-degree."

Larae was admitted to Holy Rosary Hospital in Ontario after the accident. She remained hospitalized over the weekend and was released to her parents Monday morning, July 9.

On Tuesday, July 10, Mrs. Robinson reported that her daughter was at home recovering from the burns.
