Nyssa Woman

Injured

A 28-year-old Nyssa woman was listed in satisfactory condition Monday at Holy Rosary Hospital where she is receiving treatment of multiple injuries, including a fractured jaw, after a Saturday night accident at Cairo Junction.

According to Oregon State Police, the accident involved a large truck tractor and flatbed trailer operated by Harvey Martin Shields, 46, of Springfield, and a passenger car driven by Joan Frances Silence, Nyssa.

Police said Ms. Silence received several lacerations of the face, dislocated bones, the injured jaw and possible other injuries. She was taken to the hospital by ambulance.

Police said the truck had been eastbound on Highway 20 and then turned northward onto Highway 201 at the junction. The northbound Silence car collided with the trailer. Heavy damage resulted to the front of the car but the truck received little damage, police said.

The accident is still under investigation.
