

# OREGON, IDAHO SENATORS INTRODUCE LEGISLATION FOR HELLS CANYON AREA

Hatfield, Bob Packwood and James McClure introduced legislation Monday to create a new Hells Canyon National Recreation Area.

Their action follows several months of meetings between the Oregon and Idaho Senators and represents a concensus among the four lawmakers on the best management plan for the Hells Canyon region.

"This legislation," the four Senators said in a joint state-ment, "will offer permanent protection for the Middle Snake River and the Hells Canvon area. The bill represents the culmination of a study we began at the start of the 93rd Congress,

Major features of the legislation include:

-Creation of a Hells Canyon National Recreation Area, consisting principally of the canyon and its surroundings.

-Creation, within the Recreaa years' long effort to protect tion Area, of a Hells Canyon Wilderness.

-The total prohibition on construction of any further dams along the Middle Snake River in Hells Canyon, be taken,

-Language which protects upstream water rights in Idaho. -A specific directive that existing grazing on public lands with the Recreation Area and the Wilderness Area shall be allowed to continue.


