OSU WILL OFFER RESOURCE DEGREE

Oregon State University this fall will offer a new program leading to a bachelor's degree in resource recreation management.

The four-year program will provide preparation in three options: outdoor recreation, environmental interpretation and park administration.

The curriculum will lead to the bachelor of arts or bachelor of science degree. A graduate minor in resource recreation management is also offered through OSU's Graduate School.

Some 26 courses in resource recreation were approved by the State Board of Higher Education to be offered in the curriculum.
