An explosion in a rented camping trailer Wednesday night sent members of a Nyssa family to Malheur Memorial Hospital for treatment of burns about the legs.

According to Malheur Deputy Sheriff Dick Pounds, the family had gone to the mountains about 21 miles from Prairie City Wednesday night and the explosion occurred as the supper meal was about to be prepared.

Sunset Valley and area was deeply saddened July 27 when Gabriel Astoreca was taken by an apparent heart attack around 6:20 in the evening. Neighbors were on hand almost instantly but efforts to revive him were useless.

Cheryl and Mrs. Pounds both received burns but another daughter, Terry, escaped uninjured. The three were at the breakfast nook inside the trailer when the explosion occurred and Pounds was outside.

Again on Sunday evening another tragic death occurred in the area when Danny Nelson rolled down-hill in his jeep. Danny was the husband of Cynthia Nelson, nee Cynthia Chapin

Pounds got the family members out of the trailer but the trailer and its contents were consumed by fire.

First aid treatment to the victims was administered by the police chief at Prairie City.
