Cran-Apple Cooler

Combine juice of 3 lemons, 3 cups of sugar, 20 small mint leaves and 2 cups of water. Boil and let simmer 5 minutes. After cooling, strain; chill. Combine this mint syrup, 1 quart (4 cups) Ocean Spray cranberry-apple drink and 1 quart of club soda in a punch bowl. Add ice cubes. Garnish with lemon slices and more mint leaves. Serve in chilled punch cups. Makes 12 to 14 cup servings.

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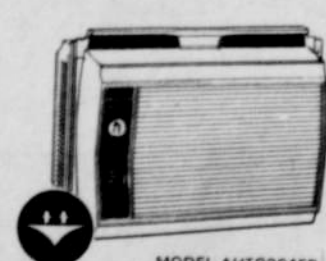
