The Happy Dozen Card Club met Friday with Mable Piery in Adrian.

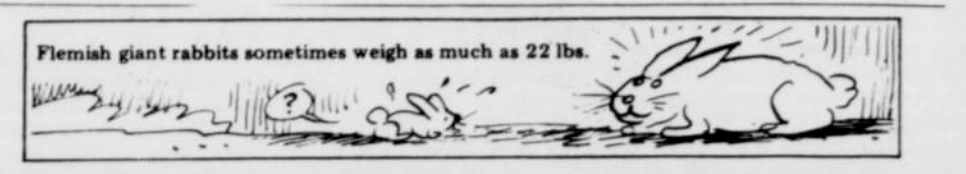
Guest players were Doris Castor, Wilma Powell, and Myrtle Sasser.
