Football Starts For Nyssa Bulldogs

Nyssa High School's football coach Art Bullock took one look at the thirty boys who turned out for fall football practice this Monday and mentally asked himself, "where are the seniors?"

As it turned out, only six seniors showed up for the first official practice session.

During the first meeting, this year's players were issued their gear and given a general introduction to the Nyssa Bulldog football program.

"This is your playbook," said Bullock as he started to pass out notebooks to the players. "If you lose this you'd better have lots of death insurance, because your parents will need it."

"Remember," said Bullock, "that if Ontario gets their hands on this you'll be the one who'll take the beating out on the field."

A new offense was outlined for the players by Gerald Talbot, offensive coach, and then the boys charged outside to begin the long, hard job of working off a summer of "soft living".

This week, according to Bullock, the team is on a twice-a-day practice schedule and will work mainly on conditioning, timing and fundamentals. After this week the team will practice only once each day and will start working on plays and pass patterns.

All of this year's players, including the six seniors, will have to learn a new offense which the coaching staff has designed to take advantage of size and speed of the younger players.

The coaching staff this year will be highly specialized and will include: Art Bullock, head coach; Gerald Talbot, offensive coach; Max Brittingham, defensive coach; Jerry Huntley, line coach; Vernon Lords, frosh-soph coach; Adrian Wegner and Dennis Savage, eighth grade; and Glenn Walker, seventh grade coach.

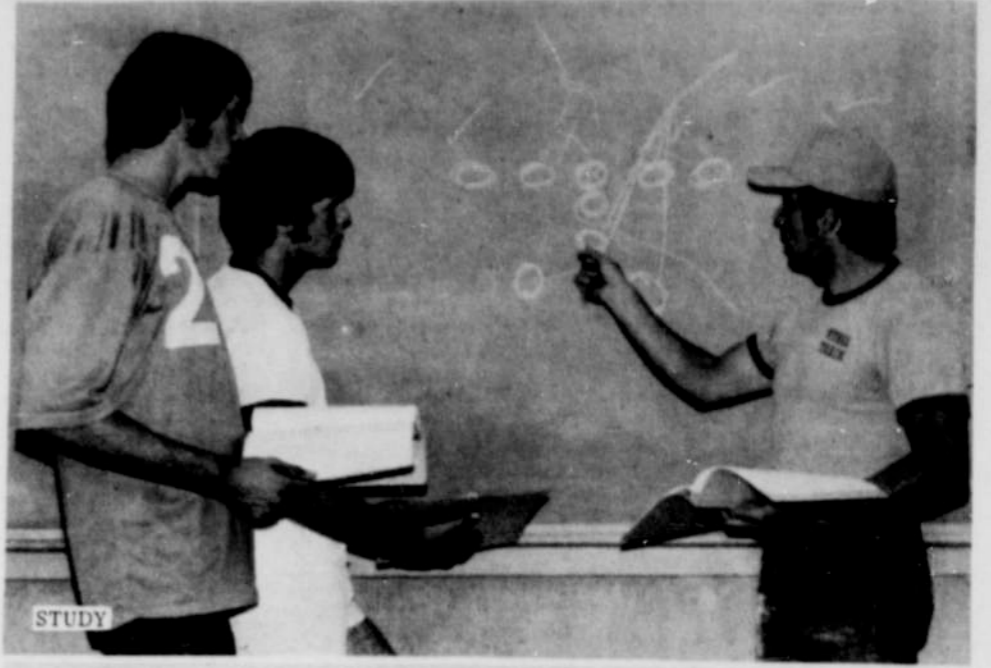
"We should get 15 or 20 more boys when school starts," said Bullock, "but as far as I'm concerned, we'll play the boys who work, probably, that means the boys who are out here now."

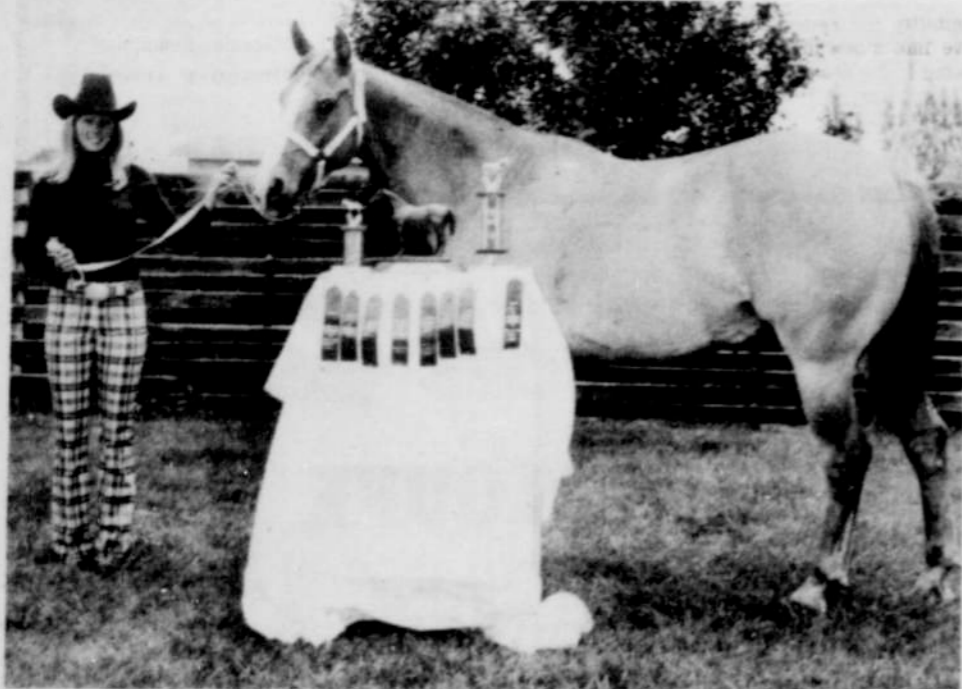

Cindy Sawyer, last year's Nyssa Night Rodeo Queen, has spent much of this summer in the rodeo spotlight in her new home state, Idaho.

On June 9, 16-year-old Cindy rode her registered quarter horse, Sammy Snip, to place in nine out of the ten events she entered in the Minidoka

Wrangler Horse Show in Rupert, Idaho.

For her showing, Cindy was awarded the American Quarter Horse Association "all-around youth" trophy.

Later in the summer, on July 14, she was crowned Frontier Rodeo Queen for Pocastello's rodeo. It was the first time, her parents said, that anyone under 18 had won the title.

Also, in between the above honors, she was runner-up in American Falls for the Spring Rodeo Queen.

Cindy is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Darrel Sawyer and was Pee-wee Rodeo Queen in 1971 and was Nyssa Night

Rodeo Queen in 1972. Earlier this year the Sawyers moved to American Falls when Darrel became manager of a cattle company there.

Cindy has been riding for 13 years and most of her riding time for the past 5 years has been on Sammy Snip. Sammy was rough broke for her, but all of his training beyond that, according to her parents, has been handled by Cindy.

This September Cindy is a junior at American Falls High School. Her future, no doubt, will hold many more rodeo accomplishments and her friends in Nyssa will continue to root for Cindy.
