

Nyssa Bulldogs Ready, '73 Season Opens At Ontario

Nyssa High School's football team, the Bulldogs, are only two short days away from their first game of the 1973 season and, according to the coaches, the team is starting to jell.

"We feel better about 'em," said Head Coach Art Bullock. "Working with inexperienced kids, they begin to come around a little bit better and these kids are starting to come around."

THIS FRIDAY, September 7, at 8:00 p.m., the Bulldogs will find out just how far they've come when they travel to Ontario and go up against the Ontario High School football squad.

"We're handicapped with not having as many kids to work from," said Bullock, considering the Ontario competition. "I think we'll be handicapped with not having the weight or the size they have; hopefully, though, we'll hold our own."

WHATEVER the handicaps, however, Bullock said the Bulldogs will be well prepared for the Friday night game. "I'm very pleased with the team-coaching system," said Bullock. "I think all three coaches have done an extremely good job."

OFFENSE
"I'm a lot more pleased with what's happening," said Gerald Talbot, Offensive coach. "I think that it's taken us about two weeks now to begin to accept and understand the system."
"THE MAJORITY of the backfield is pretty well set," said Talbot. "Chris Lord is looking real good at tailback and Dwight Calhoun is doing a real good job at quarterback."

"We have two guys essentially that are playing a lot of slotback, Kevin Adams and Brad Holcomb. We have one other guy who could play slotback for us and may play slotback, but were going to switch him between slotback and splitend, that's Lee Ollison."

TVCC Grid Squad Lists 20 Frosh

Twenty freshman gridders have turned out for the first week of training in preparation for the Chukar's season opener on the road against Columbia Basin at Pasco. The team worked out the first two days without pads morning and evening. They were fully uniformed Wednesday and began contact.

Among the new players trying for positions is Duncan MacKenzie, Adrian linebacker. He is 19 years old, 6 feet tall and weighs 188 pounds.

Another Malheur County player is Arnold Lewis of Vale, who played center and line-backer in high school. Lewis is 17, stands six feet and weighs 180 pounds.

Game Commission Plans To Treat Reservoirs

The Oregon State Game Commission has approved plans to chemically rehabilitate several important angling waters in Malheur county. These include Beulah and Bully Creek reservoirs and portions of the North Fork, Middle Fork and main Malheur rivers. The project will begin below Warm Springs reservoir on the Middle Fork, above Beulah reservoir on the North Fork and encompass 68 miles of stream down to Namoff Diversion Dam. In addition, approximately 35 miles of irrigation canal will be treated. The project will begin when reservoir storage is near minimum and when flows in the streams and canal are low but adequate to carry the chemical. This will probably occur about the second week of September.

The chemical used will be a solution of rotenone. Rotenone is an extract from the roots of the derris plant which grows in South America. It is harmless to warm blooded animals but restricts the respiration of fish and kills all species. Fish killed by the chemical are safe for human consumption. Rotenone loses its toxicity rapidly. This allows aquatic insects to come back rapidly and permits restocking of game fish shortly after treatment.

Reservoirs and streams in the Malheur river system historically have provided excellent angling for rainbow trout. Rainbow trout require high-quality, running water and clean gravel for spawning and thus do not reproduce in most re-

"I definitely think we can run against Ontario," said Talbot. "We'll try to set up a good solid ground game and then start working on the short passes and then come with the long pass later on."

"We have two quarterbacks that can throw the ball short and throw it well," said Talbot. "That's Dwight Calhoun and Neal Oldemeyer, who is just a sophomore and who could develop in the position and allow Dwight to get back and play some of his normal halfback position."

IN ADDITION to a new offensive set, Talbot said, "another aspect that we haven't used in the past, that the people will see different this time is that we will use our backs as pass receivers. We'll swing them out of the backfield and throw to them."

OFFENSIVE LINE
"I think we can be as competitive as we want to be," said Jerry Huntley, Line coach. "I would venture to say that we can give Ontario more than they want."

"If we can beat 'em in the line we can beat 'em."

"PROBABLY my most improved player, and the biggest surprise," said Huntley "is Robert Gallegos at left tackle." "Tom Church will be my center and Ted Joyce will be at right guard, but the left guard is still up for grabs."

"We haven't gotten any bigger," said Huntley jokingly. "They're starting to learn how to block with their size, use their size actually for an advantage to stay low."

"They've come a long way."

DEFENSE
"Defensively we're really starting to fill some slots," said Max Brittingham, Defensive coach.

"Defensive ends Jeff Marquez and Frank Moore have looked real good there. Defensive tackle, David Mitchell and Dirk Sappe, a freshman are both looking good."

"Although we aren't really that big," said Brittingham "I think we're going to have a pretty fair pass-rush, Marquez and Moore on the ends are pretty tall."

"Linebackers," said Brittingham "will be Kevin Adams and Chris Lord at the outside." "Ted Joyce is playing the middle, also, he'll be the defensive captain and the defensive signal caller."

"Dwight Calhoun, Roy Mosqueda, Louis Mosqueda and Prudencio Escobedo, all four of those will be playing somewhere in the defensive backfield."

"I'm fairly well pleased with the progress of the defense," said Brittingham. "They've adjusted to the sets, and different defenses that we've used."

SPEAKING FOR all of the coaches, Art Bullock said, "They're playing more a team ball than they were."

"This is to be expected, after working with them for a few weeks just before the first game you hope to have 'em jell and you hope to have 'em at the right peak."

"Hopefully," said Bullock, "we have them there now."
