**Apple Pie Is Still Tops In Appeal**



There may be desserts "easier than pie," but few are as cherished. Especially that all-time favorite - apple! It's better than ever when enveloped in a crisp and flaky lattice crust enhanced by quick or old fashioned oats. An oats crust is the greatest thing to happen to apples since cinnamon. Try it and see!

- LATTICE-TOPPED APPLE PIE**  
Makes 8 servings
- |                                  |   |
|----------------------------------|---|
| Filling:                         | 1/2 teaspoon salt                             |
| 3/4 cup sugar                    | 1/2 cup shortening, soft                      |
| 2 tablespoons cornstarch         | 3/4 cup quick or old fashioned oats, uncooked |
| 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon            | 5 to 7 tablespoons cold water                 |
| 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg              | 1 tablespoon butter or margarine              |
| Dash salt                        |   |
| 6 cups sliced, pared tart apples |   |
- Pastry:  
1-1/4 cups sifted all-purpose flour

Heat oven to hot (425°F.). For filling, combine sugar, cornstarch, cinnamon, nutmeg and salt. Stir in apple slices until well coated. For pastry, sift together flour and salt. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in oats. Sprinkle water by tablespoonsful over mixture, stirring lightly with a fork until dry ingredients are moistened. Form into a ball. Divide dough in half. Roll out one half on a lightly floured board or canvas to form a 13-inch circle. Put pastry loosely into a 9-inch pie plate. Spoon filling into pastry-lined pie plate. Dot with butter. Roll out remaining half of dough to a 12-inch circle; cut into 1-inch strips. Place pastry strips over filling. Trim; fold edges under and flute. Bake in preheated oven (425°F.) 15 minutes. Reduce heat to moderate (375°F.). Bake an additional 30 to 35 minutes. Remove from oven and sprinkle pie lightly with sugar.
