**Favorite Foods**

Have you made relishes using a variety of spices? I have a zucchini relish recipe and as I was making it yesterday I found I couldn't find one of the spices. I rummaged through all my spices - moved all the bottles in the cupboard and still didn't find it. Then I called on help from a neighbor and she even climbed up on her kitchen stool to help in the search for this lost jewel! Then, presto, there it was! How many of you have had this kitchen adventure. It would have been easier to buy a new box.

The zucchini, onions and peppers were all ground in our blender, then drained and rinsed in a large sieve.

4 cups sugar  
1 tsp. celery salt  
1 tsp. cinnamon  
1/2 tsp. pepper  
1 tsp. dry mustard  
1 tsp. turmeric

Boil this mixture in saucepan, on medium heat, for 30 minutes. Ladle into sterilized pint jars and seal. Makes 5 pints.

Harvest times brings back memories of the way our mothers cooked. Mine was an excellent cook and made good use of our bountiful harvest of fruits. Apples and pears were important during my childhood. I'm reminded of this when I make Pear Amber.

PEAR AMBER  
12 medium sized Bartlett pears  
2 oranges  
1 #2 can crushed pineapple, drained  
sugar  
1 4 oz. bottle marachino cherries

Wash, pare and remove cores of pears. Cut into small pieces. Wash oranges. Chop fine or grind, using whole oranges. Combine pears, oranges and pineapple. Measure. Add 3/4 as much sugar as fruit pulp. Mix thoroughly. Spread mixture over bottom of broiler pan. Place broiler pan on rack in center of oven. Cook fruit in a 325 degree oven for 45 minutes, or until pears are transparent, stirring occasionally. Add cherries which have been thinly sliced. Continue cooking 5 minutes longer. Pour into hot sterilized jars. Seal at once with melted paraffin. Makes 4 or 5 pints.
