### Driving Expert Says Plan Ahead

Driving by intention instead of instinct can stretch gasoline mileage for America's fuel-conscious motorists, says the head of a group that drives test cars for a living.

"Most motorists tend to think about their driving maneuvers only in terms of immediate need or opportunity," said Fred Bardwell, manager of The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company's 7,300-acre tire proving grounds in San Angelo, Tex. "Thus, they have to make quick stops when something comes up ahead of them and gun their engines when the way is clear again."

The net effect is wasted gasoline. "The key is planning and anticipation," Bardwell says, "planning ahead to avoid unnecessary quick stops and starts, driving carefully and basic preventative maintenance."

First place prizes are two new Volkswagen sedans, one for the men and one for the women bowlers. One is donated by the Volkswagen dealers of Oregon and one by the bowling proprietors. There are 42 prizes in all, 21 for the men and 21 for the women.

## Using Lights On Game Against Hunting Laws

A new law passed by the 1973 session of the Oregon Legislature directly concerns the casting of lights upon game mammals and livestock. The main points of the law essentially read as follows:

SECTION 2. (1) No person shall cast from a motor vehicle or from within 500 feet of a motor vehicle an artificial light upon any game mammal or livestock while there is in his possession or in his immediate physical presence a weapon with which the game mammal or livestock could be killed.

(2) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to a person who casts artificial light upon a game mammal or livestock:

(a) From the headlights of a motor vehicle that is being operated on a road in the usual manner, if that person makes no attempt to kill the game mammal or livestock; or

(b) When the weapon that person has in his possession or immediate physical presence is disassembled or stored, or in the trunk or storage compartment of a motor vehicle; or

(c) On land owned or lawfully occupied by that person; or

(d) On publicly owned land when that person has an agreement with the public body to use that property.

The law will take effect immediately prior to the 1973 deer season.
