From Mt. Rushmore we went to Newcastle, Wyoming. In Casper we saw the old fort and from here we drove through the beautiful Teton Mountains. We saw Jenny Lake nestled in the deep forest at the foot of Teton peaks. The Chapel of Transfiguration is located near the historic Menor's Ferry on the Snake River. This picturesque chapel was designed to give an inspiring view of the Teton peaks.

We climbed the steep mountain range to Idaho Falls, Idaho. We went to Fairfield and spent the night at the Methodist Sawtooth Camp, where we had spent two summers.

We arrived home on July 29 in time for Bible Study on Sunday evening. We had been gone for four months and two days.
