Favorite Foods

When I make pumpkin pie I usually use the recipe on the back of the can of one of the nationally known brands of pumpkin.

Yesterday I tasted a pumpkin chiffon pie which was really good and which ushered in the "pumpkin season." It's luscious, fluffy and delicious.

PUMPKIN CHIFFON PIE

1 baked 9-inch pie crust
1 tsp. gelatin
1/4 cup cold water
3/4 cup brown sugar
1/2 tsp. salt
2 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp pumpkin pie spice mix
1 1/3 cups mashed, cooked pumpkin
3 large egg yolks
1/2 cup milk

Blend gelatin and water. Mix together in a sauce pan the brown sugar, salt, cinnamon, spice mix, cooked pumpkin, egg yolks and milk. Cook over low heat, stirring until it boils. Cook 1 minute, remove from heat. Stir in softened gelatin. Cool. When partially set, beat until smooth.

Carefully fold in egg whites which have been beaten for at least 5 minutes with 1/4 teas-

poon cream of tartar and 1/2 cup sugar. Garnish with a whipped topping. Serves 6.

You've heard of Crazy Cakes! This apple cake might be labeled just that because its easy to mix. The secret is to have a blender to grind the apples - this makes it apple pie easy.

APPLE CAKE

4 cups raw apples, diced fine
2 cups sugar
2 1/2 cups flour
1 teaspoon salt
2 teaspoons soda
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 cup vegetable oil
2 eggs beaten
1 teaspoon cinnamon
2 teaspoons vanilla
1/2 cup nuts, chopped

Dice apples in a large bowl, add sugar and mix well. Sift flour, salt, soda, nutmeg and cinnamon together. Pour over apple mixture and blend. Make a hole in the center of batter and add oil, eggs and vanilla. Stir and blend well. Pour into a well greased 9" x 13" x 2" pan and bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. This makes a very moist cake and does not require frosting.
