However, the business office does need to know your correct name, address, age, date of birth, nationality, religious preference, whether you have insurance, and how you intend to take care of the account.

It is often asked, "Why does the business office need so many questions answered?" The only questions the business office needs answered are those which pertain to the patient and his record. A complete medical record is kept of each hospitalized patient, and these records are permanent re-


