If you bought a large turkey for Thanksgiving and have left-overs use them in soups, salads, and sandwiches. By freezing the left-over turkey for a couple of weeks, you can make a gourmet dish out of it.

California Turkey Salad is the answer. This combination makes an excellent salad.

CALIFORNIA TURKEY SALAD

- 2 cups turkey, diced
- 1 cup celery, cubed
- 1 cup seedless white grapes (sliced)
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 teaspoon Accent
- 1 teaspoon salt or substitute
- 1/2 cup toasted almonds
- 1 head lettuce

Dice turkey into large cubes, add celery and sliced grapes. Mix in mayonnaise and seasonings. Sprinkle with toasted almonds. Serve on shredded lettuce.

White raisins have been a bit hard to find but they are available from time to time. To prepare them for the cake, I pour the raisins into a saucepan, cover them with water and bring them to a boil. Remove them from the range, let them stand for several hours and drain.

ELEGANT FRUIT CAKE (White)

- 1 lb. butter
- 3 cups sugar
- 6 eggs, separated
- 5 cups flour (reserve 2 cups to dredge fruit)
- 1 teaspoon soda
- 1/3 cup cooking wine or orange juice
- 1 - 2 oz. bottle lemon extract (yes! a 2 oz. bottle)
- 6 cups pecans or walnuts, chopped
- 1/2 lb. candied pineapple
- 1/2 lb. candied cherries
- 2 cups white raisins

Cream butter and sugar. Add egg yolks and beat until smooth. Stir in flour and soda, alternating with lemon extract and wine. Add dredged nuts and fruit. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into foil lined 1 1/2 lb. pans and bake at 275 degrees for 2 hours, or until done. Cool. Sprinkle with wine, wrap in foil and store. Makes five 1 to 1 1/2 lb. loaves.

DAIRY CATTLE SEMINAR DEC. 4

Dairymen as well as beef cattle producers will be offered one of the most complete programs on animal reproduction problems December 4--10:00 a.m. - Golden Slipper at Vale, according to Ray Novotny, County Agent. The agent emphasized that one of the most serious problems facing dairymen is reproduction.

Oregon State University and the Oregon Dairymen's Association are cooperating to present the session in the county Novotny, stated. "That some of the very 'top' people in the field of animal physiology and reproduction will be present."

Dr. Bob Mallorie, Silverton, a 1,000 cow dairy operator, Director of O.D.A. and a veterinarian will discuss "Cattle Reproduction Problems and Breeding Management." Dr. Fred Stormshak, O.S.U., Physiologist, will present "Physiology of Bovine Reproduction," Novotny stated.

Livestock Producers To Study Disease

Livestock producers who have suffered cattle losses from disease or nutritional problems will want to attend meetings arranged to discuss these problems December 13 in Vale at the Vale Grange Hall or at Jordan Valley at the High School on December 14, according to George Bain, Malheur County Extension Agent.

Presenting the information at these meetings from 1:30 - 4:30 p.m. both days will be Dr. Guy Reynolds, DVM, Oregon State University Extension Service. The primary purpose of these meetings, Bain says, is to provide information to ranchers about some of the nutritional deficiencies that may be causing breeding problems or losses and some preventative measures that can be taken to prevent losses from common disease of cattle.
