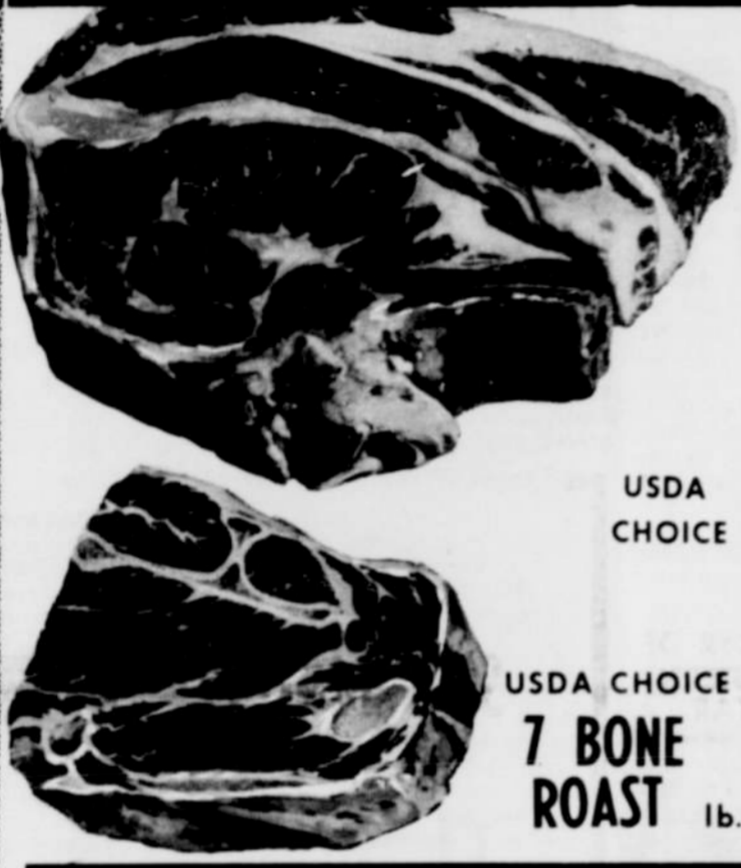
Mrs. Kenneth Cottle and Mrs. Frell Blair returned Monday after spending one week visiting Vesta Hansen at Smithville, Utah.
