Fewer restrictions on off-duty travel and improved living facilities are other benefits of the program.

Pvt. Castro began his training with Company C, 4th Battalion, 1st Brigade on Nov. 3 and is scheduled to complete the first phase on December 17.

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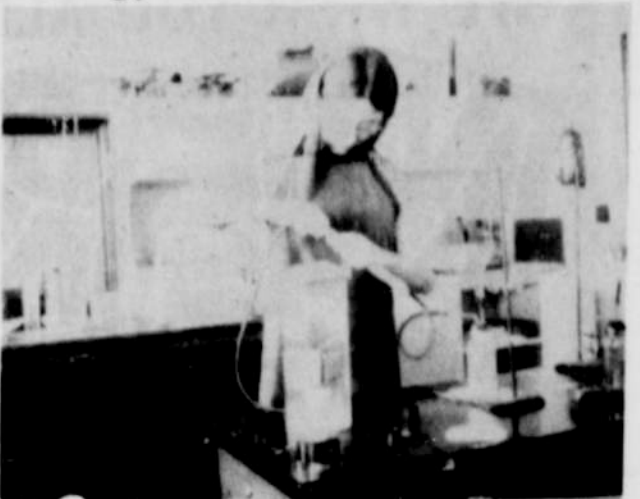
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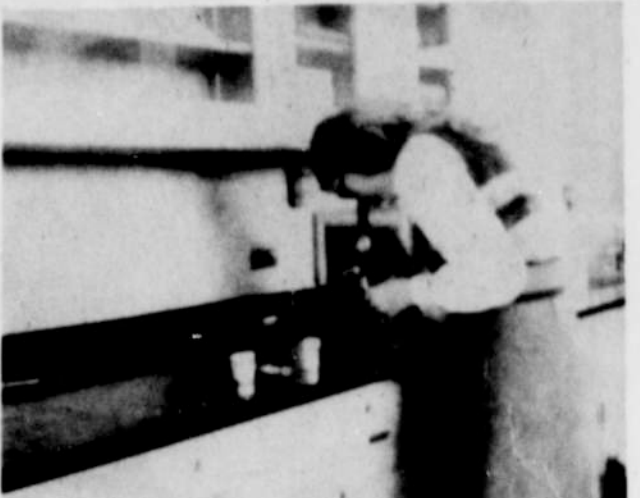
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Biology 11 Research Projects
