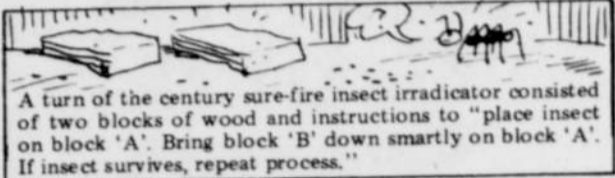

Favorite Foods

- December is cookie month so I checked my file and found a real favorite. Everyone I talk with is making goodies for friends and family and Butterscotch Nut Drops will please old and young alike.
- BUTTERSCOTCH NUT DROPS**
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, softened
 - 1 1/2 cups firmly packed light brown sugar
 - 2 eggs
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla
 - 1 cup dairy sour cream
 - 2 1/2 cups flour
 - 1 teaspoon baking soda
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1/2 teaspoon baking pwr.
 - 1/2 cup finely chopped nuts.
- Cream butter and sugar together until well blended; mix in eggs, beating well after each addition. Blend in vanilla and sour cream. Sift together flour, baking soda, salt and baking powder; combine with creamed mixture. Add nuts; chill until firm. Drop from teaspoon onto cookie sheet about 2 inches apart. Bake 8-10 minutes at 400 degrees. Remove to cookie rack and frost.

I tasted the best Shrimp Casserole in Boise last week. The real proof came when five of the guests "just had" to have the recipe.

The rice may be cooked separately and the shrimp served hot over the steaming rice. The rice may also be placed in the bottom of the casserole and the sauce heated with it.

The almonds give the dish texture and distinctive flavor.

- ALMOND SHRIMP & RICE**
- 1/3 cup almonds, slivered
 - 1/2 tsp. salad oil
 - 2 tbsp. onion, chopped
 - 1 tbsp. green pepper, chopped
 - 1 tbsp. butter
 - 1/4 tsp. curry powder
 - 1-10 oz. can mushroom soup
 - 1/4 cup milk
 - 1-6 oz. can shrimp
 - 1/3 cup sour cream
 - Hot, fluffy rice.
- Cook chopped onion and green pepper slowly in the butter until tender but not brown. Add curry powder, mushroom soup and milk. Blend well. Heat thoroughly. Blend in shrimp and sour cream. Heat thoroughly. Stir in almonds. Serve at once over rice. Makes 6 servings.
