



A total of 100,000 acres of Malheur County's crop land is taken up in pasture and alfalfa production, according to Ray Novotny, County Agent.

The agent emphasized that the 60,000 acres of alfalfa and 40,000 acres of irrigated pasture are significant to the \$30 million beef and dairy industry.

All ranchers and farmers are urged to attend a short course highlighting alfalfapasture production February 13 - 14 - 1:30 - 4:00 p.m. Grange Hall, Vale.

Highlights of the short course according to Novotny are, alfalfa fertility, management, quality, varieties, clinical weed control and other factors contributing to increased production along with pasture management, production and forage utilization for maxium returns. A panel made up of Harry Featherston, Clyde Cowgill, Donna Faw and Kermit Bennett are scheduled to discuss pasture problems and program opportunities.

der At the next meeting we made banana boats, then we cleaned up and played games.


