

Idaho Seeks Amtrak Funds

Governor Cecil D. Andrus has released a letter from Amtrak Vice-President R. Moot which apparently closes the door on the possibility of train service for Southern Idaho this year.

At the same time, however, the Governor announced he has requested the Pacific Northwest Regional Commission, of which he is chairman, to launch a study of the feasibility of the Commission possibly picking up two-thirds of the deficit incurred by Amtrak in operating rail passenger service from Seattle to Kansas City via Southern Idaho and Denver, if the amount

is not too prohibitive.
