SPECIAL BANANA CAKE

- 1/2 cup butter, softened
 - 1 1/3 cups sugar
 - 2 eggs
 - 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla
 - 2 cups flour
 - 3/4 teaspoon salt
 - 3 teaspoons baking powder
 - 1/2 cup milk
 - 1 cup mashed banana (2 or 3)
 - 1 cup dairy sour cream
 - 1 (12-ounce) package semisweet chocolate pieces, melted
- Beat butter with sugar until fluffy. Beat in eggs and vanilla. Mix flour, salt and baking powder. Beat into batter alternately with milk. Fold in mashed banana. Turn into two-greased and floured 8-inch round layer cake pans. Bake in 350 degree oven 30 to 35 minutes or until light touch in center leaves no imprint. Cool 10 minutes in pans. Remove from pans and cool on racks. Blend sour cream into warm melted chocolate. Spread over cake and stack layers. Decorate with sliced fresh bananas just before serving, if you like. Makes 8 servings.
