## Breast Cancer Detection Now Available for Area Women

Nyssa area women are becoming more aware of the fact that they can have the very best breast examination available at the Breast Cancer Detection Center in Boise, without any cost whatsoever. All they need to do is make an appointment with Mrs. Willis (Eris) Bertram, local Nyssa area volunteer by calling 372-2876. Many women have already made appointments. Have you? It could very well be the most important phone call you will ever make in your whole life!

The Breast Cancer Detection Center opened its doors last October. The facilities are funded for two years by the American Cancer Society and National Cancer Institute. In this two-year period, they hope to establish the permanent need for this center. It is part of the Mountain States Tumor Institute, but is located in a remodeled cottage, located at the corner of Jefferson and Avenue "B", one block from St. Luke's Hospital. Women in the Nyssa area are fortunate to have a center so close. There are 20 centers in the United States, three are located in the west, at Seattle, Salt Lake and San Francisco. The others are located in the east.

are free of breast cancer, at least for a year, at which time you return again for another timely examination. Each town in the Snake River Valley is given a "block" of time, which is one day. Appointments are scheduled just for them for the major part of the day, with slots available for special cases. Two days for Nyssa have already been filled. Presently, the earliest date assigned is August 1. If you chose to make your own appointment directly through the center, the earliest date would be November. Single appointments up to "carload" appointments can be made. If six women go together, the first one through would not have to wait longer than one-half hour for the last one to be finished. Women are advised to wear slacks and no deodorant.

A woman must be 35 years or older to qualify for this breast cancer examination. However, if she is younger than 35, she is eligible if she has had breast surgery for cancer or if she has two blood relatives who have had breast cancer. No nursing mothers or pregnant women accepted.

The examination is made by well-trained personnel using ultra-modern equipment. Volunteers assist with medical history, etc. You will be confident in the knowledge that you have had the most thorough examination possible.

You will learn the results in approximately two weeks.

Dr. Alfred M. Popma, nationally known Boise doctor, is director of the Boise center. He has also been the national president of the American Cancer Society and is the creator of the movie "Self Examination of the Breast."

The centers purpose is two-fold. First, through research and the compiling of all information gained from the detailed histories taken of each patient, it is hoped to eventually be able to find the CAUSE of cancer. Secondly, to find cancer, if it exists, at its earliest stages.

## OBITUARIES

### Avo Elfa Moeller

Services for Avo Elfa Moeller, 66, who passed away at her home in Arcadia Community, Friday, March 15, 1974, after a lengthy illness, were conducted at 2 p.m., Monday at Bertelson-Lienkaemper Memorial Chapel in Ontario by the Rev. Ed. Bussert, pastor of Malheur Butte Baptist Church, and the Rev. J. T. Kindall of the Assembly of God Church, Boise. Interment was at Evergreen Cemetery in Ontario.



Avo was born at Cabanal, near the town of Berryville, Arkansas, September 16, 1907. She was the second child of a family of thirteen children born to Mr. and Mrs. Sam McKinney. She came to the Arcadia Community, in 1929, to stay with her sister, Mrs. Los Snow, who lived at the corner of Gem Avenue and Clark Blvd. She was a lively addition to the community, working in homes as a "hired girl" and working in the orchards. She could put her hand to anything, cheerfully and willingly.

Her sister, later moved to the teachership at Arcadia and it was there, at a baseball game, that she met her future husband, George Moeller, son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Moeller of Valley View Community. They were married March 7, 1931 in Caldwell, Idaho. To this union were born three children, a son on June 20, 1934 who died in November of that year; two daughters, Joretta born in 1937 and Jean in 1940. Jean died of polio in 1955.

Mrs. Moeller became a Christian early in life. She was instrumental in organizing the Arcadia Union Sunday School and was a very active member until it was discontinued when the schools were consolidated in the 1940's. Of late years she attended the Malheur Conservative Baptist Church near Malheur Butte. She was the last charter member of the Arcadia Sunshine Club which organized in 1935. Avo was the kind of a neighbor we hear about from pioneer times. When a family moved into the neighborhood, they had a visit from a lady with a big bouquet of flowers and something from her kitchen or garden. She believed in putting the teachings of the Bible into every day practice. She will be greatly missed.

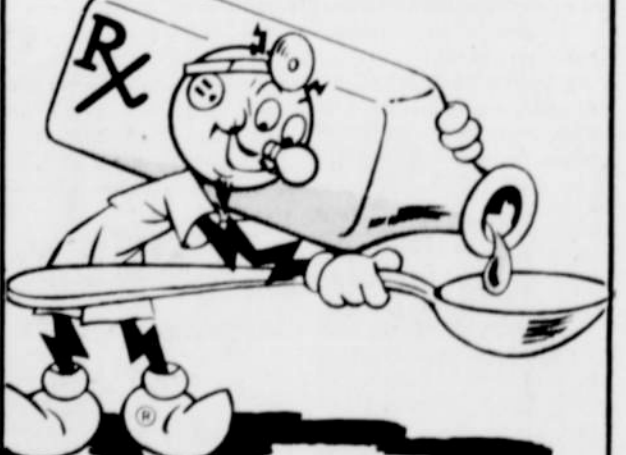

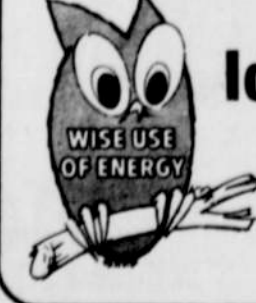
