Gov. McCall Named Conservationist of Year

Governor Tom McCall has been selected "Conservationist of the Year" by the nation's largest conservation organization, the National Wildlife Federation. The governor will receive the award March 30 in Denver, Colorado, during the 38th annual meeting of the federation. The federation anticipates that 1,000 of its 3 1/2 million members will attend.

In announcing the award to McCall, the federation said he was chosen "for his strong leadership and foresight in a number of statewide conservation programs, which have made Oregon an

environmental bellwether of the nation."

The federation's other major award this year will go to Congressman Morris Udall of Arizona, who was named "Legislator of the Year."

Robert Stack, film personality and National Wildlife Federation board member, will be master of ceremonies for the awards banquet.

County Agent Says

BUDGET AND COSTS INCREASE

During the past six weeks, two items in your budget have jumped clear out of sight. They are fertilizer and fuel costs. If you have made your 1974 budget, it may be well to take another look at these items and make sure that you have enough to take care of the increases that have hit the past few weeks.

Indications are that fertilizers have increased between 80 and 100% during the past six weeks and are still going up. Fuels for farm deliveries have gone up close to 25-30% in the past six weeks and they too are still going up; so keep your eyes on these two items and be ready to make some quick responses, so that you don't get 3/4 through the season and find yourself falling short of your projected budget.
