Speaking To The Consumer

BETTER DEAL FOR SUBSCRIBERS. The Federal Trade Commission has issued rules governing "negative option sale," a selling technique used by book and record clubs. The new rules that go into effect June 7 provide that the subscriber be given a minimum of ten days in which to instruct the seller not to mail the selection; that all promotional material clearly disclose the terms of the plans; and that the seller give full credit and guarantee postage for merchandise returned by subscribers who were not obligated to receive it.

If you are a subscriber to a club using the negative option you will find some changes in the amount of time allowed for deciding whether or not you wish to buy the merchandise.

TAX RETURN REMINDER. Did you lose property due to storms or floods in 1973? If you have, and it wasn't covered by insurance, you may be able to use this loss as a deduction on your income tax. The first \$100 of the casualty loss is not deductible but any loss above this amount can be used as a deduction on your income tax.

STOCKING THE FREEZER? Buying meat in quantity such as a half or quarter may be a good way of saving money, but remember that meat sold in bulk is sold at its hanging weight--uncut and untrimmed. For example, a 400 pound side of beef may trim down to half that weight, so figure the price per pound accordingly. The Federal Trade Commission has suggested that firms reveal in their advertisements the average weight loss that occurs when meat is cut, trimmed and dressed for home freezer storage.

SAFETY FOR THE BABY. Cribs manufactured since January 31 must meet federal safety requirements, but there may still be some for sale that were made before that date that do not have the safety features. So if you have or are buying a previously-made crib, check it to make sure there is no more than 2-3/8 inches between the slats, and that the rail height is at least 26 inches from the mattress support to the top of the rail. See to it, also, that the mattress fits snugly against the edges of the crib, so the infant can't get caught between crib and mattress.
