REPLACEMENT HEIFERS - Grow Them Out

According to recent information U.S. Cattlemen kept 8,000,000 replacement beef heifers. Of those about 1.7 million will not calve at 2 years of age, because they are too small. On top of this about the same number calve, but will not breed back at 3 years of age, because they slip nutritionally. Feed - does make a difference - too many times heifers with calves are turned out on the range just not in good enough condition to breed - this is expensive as that dry cow doesn't help the ranch in the profit statement.
