Lucile Myrick Luncheon Guest

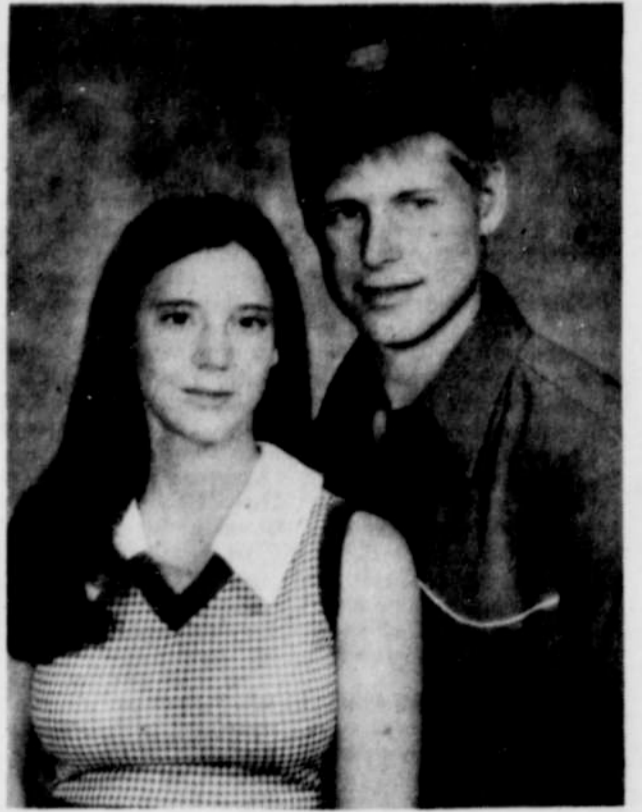

Range Owners Complete Spray

Private Range owners in Malheur County are completing spraying some 16,000 acres of sagebrush infested ranges this month, according to George Bain, County Extension Agent. With this years program some 220,000 acres of private rangeland has been treated for sagebrush control since 1968. By controlling sagebrush, the available moisture and plant nutrients are released for production of grasses and other good forage plants at least doubling the forage production where good understorey of desirable grasses exists. This practice has added some 30,000 additional animal unit months of feed in the county. This is a boost to the valuable livestock industry in Malheur County, Bain said.

U.S. Bonds Increase

The U. S. Treasury department announced today that sales of Series E and H Bonds in the State of Oregon were \$5,287,048 for the month of April. Oregon sales year-to-date of \$20,214,482 are 39% of the assigned quota of \$51,500,000. This places Oregon ninth in the nation in percentage of goal attained. Jim Leslie, Malheur County chairman, said, this county has reached 40% of its goal. Nationally, sales of \$589 million during the month set an all-time record for April. Sales exceeded redemptions by \$48 million, raising the dollar amount of Bonds outstanding to \$61,859 million. This is an increase of \$1.1 billion since December of 1973.
