Huntley Takes Head Coach Positions At Adrian High

Jerry Huntley, a Nyssa junior high school teacher and coach in three sports at Nyssa High School, has resigned and will take over head coaching duties in two sports at Adrian High School. Huntley, an assistant coach last year at Nyssa High School in football and wrestling will take head coaching duties in both sports at Adrian, according to Principal Glenn Ward. Huntley will teach social studies at Adrian High. Last year a Nyssa, Huntley

had also coached tennis and had been the junior high football coach. Nyssa School Superintendent, W. L. McPartland indicated that no replacement had been hired as yet. He said further that the football coaching staff for the coming season would probably operate with one less member—with no replacement for Huntley. Replacements for his other coaching positions have already been named as Huntley was not going to continue coaching at Nyssa.

SRV Yanks In Contention

The Snake River Valley All-Star Babe Ruth team, with three Nyssa ball players on the squad, continued to stay alive in the state championship tournament this week at Baker. The team, called the Yankees, lost the initial game in the tournament but have since continued winning and

were still in the tournament Wednesday battling for another chance at the championship double-elimination tournament. Nyssa's Greg Moffis, Raleigh Perez and Ernie Delgado are all holding spots on the team. The Yankees lost their first game to Salem, 5-2, then rebounded to beat three opponents in consolation play. Grants Pass fell 5-2, Tigard lost 5-2, and then Pendleton lost 6-3 leaving the Yankees with hope of returning to the Treasure Valley with the championship. However, they still had a long way to go—forced to win four more straight if they are to gain the championship. The win over Pendleton came despite only one hit by the SRV Yanks. Pendleton out-hit the Yanks 10-1, but lost. Five walks and three errors that went along with the one hit in the Yanks second inning awarded the winners their six runs. Pendleton got many runners on base, but couldn't get the timely hits. The final out was recorded with the bases loaded—the tying runs all on base. Ken Booth was the relief pitcher who struck out the final Pendleton batter for the SRV club. Darrin Rule had started for the Yankees and got the win.

Swimmers Earn Good Marks At Idaho State B Meet

The Nyssa swim team went to Boise last weekend and came home with some very respectable placings in the Idaho State B Meet.

In fact five members of the team did so well in the B meet that they weren't awarded placings in the B meet—instead they were awarded an entry into the Idaho State A Meet.

Twin brothers Mark and Matt Rose each earned two spots in the A Meet, along with Mike Wahlert, Megan Jackson and Kathy Bass.

Mark Rose, swimming in the 8 and under age bracket, easily swept by his competition in the 50-yard backstroke. He covered the distance in 55.6 seconds. He beat the boy who took the first place medal in the official B Meet standings by over two and one-half seconds. He also qualified in the 50-yard butterfly with a time of 1:00.1.

Brother Matt clobbered his competitors in the 100 freestyle. He beat the B Meet first placer by 10 seconds. Only one other swimmer qualified in the event for the State A Meet and Matt beat him by four and one-half seconds. He also qualified in the 50-yard butterfly with a 1:04.0 time.

Mike Wahlert also turned in a fine performance in winning the 100 freestyle for boys 13-14. His time was 1:03.5—eight-tenths of a second better than the second placer and almost four seconds better than the swimmer awarded first place in the official B Meet standings.

Megan Jackson qualified for the A Meet in the girls 15-17 100-yard freestyle. She covered the distance in 1:10.6. She placed second among three girls that qualified.

Kathy Bass qualified in the 50 freestyle for girls 15-17. Her time was 30.9, beating the standard by .6 of a second.

Many other Nyssa swimmers competed well, although missing the State A Meet qualifying standards.

Right behind Megan Jackson in the 100 freestyle for girls 15-17 was Kathy Bass. She placed third in the

official B Meet standings with a 1:13.2 clocking. Megan and Kathy also did well in the 100-yard backstroke—Megan grabbing first in 1:30.3 and Kathy second in 1:31.6—both just missing the State A standard.

Lori Lane scored a first place in the girls 13-14 100-yard breaststroke in a time of 1:31.8—missing the A standard by one-tenth of a second. Wahlert also took first place in the 50-yard freestyle with a time of 29.0. Marina Mejia was impressive in the girls 11-12 50-yard butterfly taking fourth in 42.7 and Sheila Joyce was 10th in 44.6.

Michael Sadimori took fourth in the girls 13-14 100-yard butterfly in 1:40.9. Leslie Lane was 11th in the girls 11-12 100-yard breaststroke in 1:41.5 and Julie Sarazin took a second place in the 50-yard freestyle for girls eight and under with a time of 53.2. Julie Mathews was ninth in the same event in 1:00.1.

Todd Langley got a very respectable fourth in the 50-yard backstroke in 47.7.

Other good performances for Nyssa were Matt Rose in the boys eight and under 100 yard individual medley. He

was timed in 2:10.5 for a fourth place.

Julie Sarazin took fourth in the girls eight and under 50-yard backstroke. Her time was 1:02.8.

Marina Mejia took a creditable seventh (out of 41 placers) in the girls 11-12 100-yard backstroke with a time of 1:36.2.

Larry Church was sixth with a good time of 1:29.8 in the boys 13-14 100-yard backstroke.

In the boys 11-12 100-yard freestyle Bill McMillan also took a sixth place with a time of 1:18.2.

Two Nyssa relay teams also did well. The 200-yard medley relay team for boys 13-14 took third in 2:31.0. The four swimmers were Tim McKinney, Larry Church, Mike Wahlert, and David Grieg.

The 15-17 girls 200 medley relay also got third in 2:33.9. The four swimmers were Kathy Bass, Megan Jackson, Paula Saito, and Pat Joyce.

Other Nyssa individuals also received awards for placing at the meet. Sheila Johnson was 20th in the girls 9-10 100-yard individual medley. In the same event for girls 11-12 over 200 yards Marina placed ninth. Sheila Joyce 17th, Teri

Pounds 20th and Terry Morrison 23rd. Megan Jackson took sixth in the same event for girls 15-17.

Bob Bass garnered an eighth place (out of 20 placers) in the boys 11-12 200-yard individual medley.

In the backstroke, Scott Wood placed ninth in the boys eight and under competition. In boys 9-10 Jim Rodriguez placed 19th. In boys 100-yard backstroke ages 11-12 Bill McMillan was 12th and Bob Bass 17th.

In the girls 100-yard backstroke competition, Terri Morrison and Teri Pounds, in a very large 11-12 age group, placed 38th and 39th, respectively. For girls 13-14, Pat Joyce took 16th and Michael Sadimori 17th.

In another large class of girls, 11-12 100-yard freestyle, Sheila Joyce was 25th and Teri Pounds 42nd. In the girls 13-14 bracket Michael Sadimori was 16th, Lori Lane 18th, and Pat Joyce 25th.

In the 11-12 boys competition 100-yard freestyle, Mike Wood was 28th. In the 13-14 age group Larry Church was 12th, Tim McKinney 19th and David Grieg 21st.

This weekend the Nyssa team competes in a big swim meet at Payette involving a dozen teams.

Nyssa dropped a three-way swim meet with powerful Ontario and Vale Tuesday night at Vale. Ontario won the meet followed by Vale, then Nyssa.

Six Nyssa swimmers took first places, but three of them came home with two first place medals each.

Twin brothers Mark and Matt Rose each took a pair of wins as the two continued to dominate the eight and under bracket for boys swimming. Mike Wahlert also took victories in the boys 13-14 bracket and Scott Wood, Kathy Bass and Megan Jackson each got a victory for Nyssa.

Matt Rose was first in the 100-yard individual medley with a time of 1:48.3 and he also took the 50-yard butterfly in 59.0. He also took two second places in individual events and helped two relay teams to second places.

Mark Rose won the 50-yard backstroke in 52.9 and doubled back to win 100 freestyle in 1:38.0. He beat Matt, who placed second in that race, by three-tenths of a second. Mark also helped the two relay teams to second places.

Wahlert won both the 100 butterfly and the 100 freestyle. His time in the freestyle in 1:06.4 and he took the butterfly in 1:20.4.

Scott Wood's victory came in the 50-yard freestyle with a time of 48.9. Wood also swam a leg on the medley and freestyle relay teams that the Rose brothers were on. Steve Messick was the fourth member of both relays.

Kathy Bass secured a Nyssa victory with a 30.6 in the girls 15-17 50-yard freestyle and Megan Jackson won in the 100-yard butterfly with a 1:10.3.

In a meet last week Nyssa took second in a three-way meet with Vale and Emmett. Vale won with 507 points, Nyssa earned 307 and Emmett managed only 133.

Nyssa swimmers recorded 14 times in the pool that qualified the swimmers for the Idaho State A Meet.

Leading the list was Julie Anderson and Mark Rose who each recorded three times to qualify for the A Meet. Julie qualified in the 50-yard backstroke, the 100 butterfly and the 100 freestyle, taking first in all three events for 15-17 girls at the three-way meet.

Mark qualified in the 100 freestyle and 100 IM while taking first placings and qualified in the 50 butterfly while taking second place.

Others that qualified were: Megan Jackson in the 50 and 100 freestyle races; Matt Rose in the 50 backstroke and the 100 freestyle; Mike Wahlert in the 200 IM; Lori Lane in the 100 breaststroke; Colleen McGinley in the 100 backstroke; and Kathy Bass in the 50 freestyle.

Other swimmers who took first places in the three-way meet, but missing the A qualifying standards, were: Marina Mejia with two victories, in the 100 backstroke and the 100 freestyle; Julie Sarazin in the 50 backstroke; Mike Wahlert in the 100 freestyle; Julie Mathews in the 50 breaststroke; Paula Saito in the 100 breaststroke; and Larry Haney in the 100 breaststroke.
